Island Native Dies In Alberta, Was NHL President's Father

A former Islander, George Alexander Campbell, died Friday in hospital at his adopted home in Edmonton, Alberta.

The father of Clarence Campbell, president of the National Hockey League, he spent his early years in the west as a blacksmith and machinist. He then went into the retail lumber business in which he spent most of his life.

He later moved to Saskatchewan where he held various offices and became the Mayor of Macklin, Sask., in 1919. From there he moved to Edmonton where he spent the remainder of his life.

In Edmonton he was active in politics and as an alderman was the chairman of the bylaws and finance committee.

Funeral services were held Monday and he was buried in Mount Pleasant cemetery, Edmonton.

He is survived by two sons, Clarence of Montreal, and John Mrs. C.H. Martindale and Mrs. L.J. Belenger of Edmonton and Mrs. J.A. Bowen of Ottawa; and nine grandchildren.

The Buckingham is an anti-submarine frigate and a unit of the RCN's Ninth Escort Squadron. The vessel carries approximately 150 men and is commanded by Lt.-Cmdr. Charles E. Leighton.

Commissioned during the Second World War and with the battle honor "Atlantic 1944-45" the Lanark is a unit of the South Escort Squadron. Lt.-Cmdr. John Maxwell Reid will be in command. She will carry in the vicinity of 160 men.

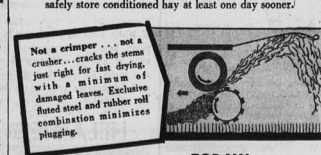

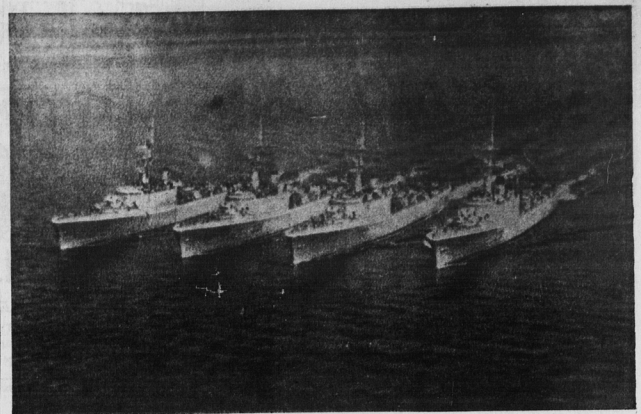
