QUEEN TO THE GORDONS.

Bids Farewell to the Troops Going to the Front.

LONDON, Friday, Oct. 22.—The Queen drove from Balmoral castle to the Balmalister barracks to bid farewell to the Gordon Highlanders, who are going to the Cape. After reviewing the troops the Queen addressed them as follows:—

"I am pleased to see you looking so well and fit for duty. You are going on foreign service, and I wish you all a God-speed. I hope you will return safe and well."

The officers were then presented to Her Majesty, the men cheering and the Queen bowing. It is rumoured that the Channel squadron has been ordered to Queens-town.

Reciprocity With West Indies.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 22.—The latest aspirants for reciprocity arrangements are the British island of St. Kitt's and Turk's island, in the West Indies. The arrangements so far cover nearly all the British West Indian possessions save these two, and Mr. Tower, the British charge, has taken the initial steps in their behalf.

Scores Die in Norway Storm

BERGEN, Oct. 22.—It is now certain that in the hurricanes that swept across Norway last Friday and Saturday thirty persons who were returning to their homes near Haugsund, south-west of Christiania, and upwards of 100 fishermen along the north-west coast near Christiansund, perished.

Coal for Transports

LONDON, Oct. 22.—The Admiralty has made huge contracts for the supply of coal to all British coaling stations on the way to the Cape, so that any British squadron will be able to coal without weakening the present supply.

Credit to the Irish.

LONDON, Oct. 22.—A despatch to the Central News from Glencoe, regarding the repulse of the Boers in battle says: "Credit on the infantry side must be accorded the Dublin Fusiliers who were first in the Boer lines and captured the guns."

NEWS NOTES.

An immense brick brewery is being built at Nelson, B. C.—a great extension of an existing brewery. The capacity of the present brewery is 550 barrels of lager and porter a day, but that does not commence to supply the demand of the thirty residents of the growing town of Nelson.

Conditions in Formosa remain unsettled. The Japanese subjects have been ordered to leave Ulsang Island, Corea, on account of the lease of that place to Russia. Russians are reported to be actively engaged in buying up land at Fusan Chin, which is to be the terminus of the proposed Fusan-Seoul Railway.
