### ON THE VERY BRINK OF WAR

#### Troops Taking up Their Positions

#### A SUPPLEMENTARY BRITISH FORCE GETTING READY TO SAIL

Boers Already Marching to the Border.

[SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER.]

ALDERSHOT, Eng., Sept 8.—The Aldershot News publishes an article, claiming to be an authoritative statement of the composition of the Home force for service in South Africa in the event of war.

This force consists of two cavalry brigades, the latter including four battalions of the guards and one Irish and one Highland brigade.

All the troops indicated are now at or near Aldershot.

The force would have quite a national character, and would mobilize here under the supreme command of Sir Redvers Buller.

CAPE TOWN, Sept 7, (midnight).—The Boers, it is stated positively, are concentrating on the border.

LONDON, Sept. 8.—The Daily Mail publishes the following dispatch from Johannesburg:—"It is currently reported from Pretoria that a special military train with a load of armed men was dispatched to the Natal border on Tuesday night with an equipment of several heavy field guns and a quantity of ammunition.

#### Another Record Breaker.

DENVER, Colo., Sept. 7.—Word has been received here that a Homing pigeon belonging to R. F. Blaney, of Grafton, W. Va., released in Denver, July 29th, reached home on August 29th, covering a distance of 1,350 miles air line in 31 days, and breaking the world's record for a long flight.

#### NEWS NOTES

The British Foreign office denies the statement cabled to a New York news paper that concessions in the Alaskan boundary question have been decided upon.

Since 1500 the Catholic Church has canonized 96 saints and beatified 230 other persons. Of the 416 only 58 were women; 79 in all were Italians, 69 Spaniards, 37 Portuguese, 14 French, 13 Dutch, 5 Belgians, 2 Poles, and 4 Germans.

#### THE TRANSVAAL CRISIS.

President Kruger's View—British All in the Wrong.

NEW YORK, Sept 7.—The World publishes the following despatch from Paul Kruger, president of the South African Republic, in response to a message sent by that paper:

"Gladly accede to your request to put the Boer side before the American public. "The present agitation against this republic emanated partly from a certain section of British residents, to whom the existence of the republic, which embraces the most flourishing parts of South Africa, is a standing eyecore, and who suffer from the prevailing jingo mania, and partly also from mining capitalists who, not content with having here the best mining laws in the world, wish also to have complete control of all existing administration.

"The franchise voting question was taken up (by England) because it was thought the republic would not yield on that point. Now that the altered franchise does not materially differ from the American—it is in many respects easier—the agitation has become worse. The object clearly is the destruction of our republic and the complete control of the best mines in the world.

"The press, entirely controlled by capitalists, spreads unprecedented misrepresentation throughout the world against the Boer republic.

"We are determined to defend to the uttermost that freedom and self-government for which our people have shed blood in every part of South Africa. Though we have no such powerful friend as you proved to Venezuela and to other republics, we have strong faith that the cause of freedom and republicanism will triumph in the end."

#### The Real Thing.

OPORTO, Sept 7.—The Pasteur institute commission, which recently arrived here to study the epidemic, asserts that it is the genuine Indian plague. The commissioners have begun treating patients with the Pasteur serum and protest against the inefficiency of the sanitary cordon.

#### Military Tournament.

OTTAWA, Sept 7.—Major General Hutton is completing arrangements for a grand military tournament at Montreal next year in which 20,000 troops from all parts of the British empire will take part.

#### Birds of a Feather.

MONTREAL, Sept 7.—The Liberals of Bonaventure will offer J Israel Tarte the nomination for the next Dominion election.
