## THE PARLIAMENT OF CANADA

### A Number of Bills Introduced

#### AN AMENDMENT OF THE CAPITAL PUNISHMENT LAW

#### Discussion Regarding the Increases in the Civil Service.

[SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER.]

OTTAWA, April 26.—In the House of Commons Mr. Ethier introduced a bill amending the criminal code in the matter of the execution of criminals.

The measure is occasioned by the revolting scene at the recent execution of Cordelia Vian and Sam Parslow at St. Scholastique.

Mr. Britton has introduced a bill to provide for the use of the McDonald voting machine in Federal elections.

Considerable discussion arose over the failure of Hon. Mr. Fisher to produce documents relating to the plebiscite from which the Minister quoted the other day.

The House went into committee of supply and had a lively discussion on increases of salaries contrary to Civil Service act, and on arbitrary selection of some officers for increases while others apparently equally efficient were passed over.

The following dates have been fixed for the Canadian military rifle league matches for the season of 1899: May 27th, June 3rd, July 8th, July 22nd. The series will be the same as last year.

Fielding has given notice of a bill to amend the insurance act. The amendment makes a change in the rate of interest which is the basis of calculation as to the value of reserves.

Beattie has introduced a bill to determine the length of a working day for workmen and laborers. The bill provides for an eight hour day.

Any employe violating it renders himself liable to a fine not exceeding \$1000 or six months imprisonment, or both.

## FRUIT GROWER'S ASSOCIATION.

The Directors of the Fruit Grower's Association of P. E. Island met in the Lieutenant Governor's office, Provincial Building, at one o'clock yesterday. A good deal of routine business was transacted, and the important matter of orchard instruction taken up. A letter was read, from Professor Robertson, conveying the assurance of the Minister of Agriculture that a competent instructor in grafting, pruning, spraying and the preservation and packing of fruit would be secured and sent here at once—provided the Provincial Government and the Association contributed. The following resolution was adopted in this regard:—

"Resolved, that the Fruit Grower's Association of Prince Edward Island, was pleased, with pleasure, of the co-operation of the Minister of Agriculture of Canada, and the Premier of this Province, in the matter of securing a competent instructor in orcharding for the present year, and will contribute so far as possible out of its funds to the said instructor's salary." The vacant vice presidency was filled by the appointment of Mr. D. A. Sharpe, Summerside. A committee consisting of Mr. H. A. Stewart, President, Mr. Joseph Wise, M. L. A., and Mr. John Robertson was appointed to interview Premier Farquharson. This they did, and received assurances from the Premier that he was in sympathy with the Association and would assist the Association as much as possible.
