FRENCH'S LAST OPERATION.

"General French occupied Barber-
ton on the 13th inst. with the cavalry
which he took across the mountains.

He met slight opposition, the enemy
being surprised. Twenty-three officers
and fifty-nine men who were prisoners
were released. Three locomotives
and other rolling stock were captured.

The former will relieve the British
force of great difficulty, as it had to
put up with a few rickety engines.

French reports that he has sufficient
supplies for three weeks for his force
and for a week for his horses. One
hundred Boers, with many Mauser
rifles and a quantity of ammunition,
were captured. There are large quan-
tities of cattle and sheep in the coun-
try, which is good news. French in-
tercepted large convoys showing that
Barberton was used as a depot for
supplies for the Boers in the south and
east. The bulk of French's force is
still thirty-five miles behind the cavalry,
owing to the difficulty of getting the
wagons over the pass leading to Bar-
berton."
