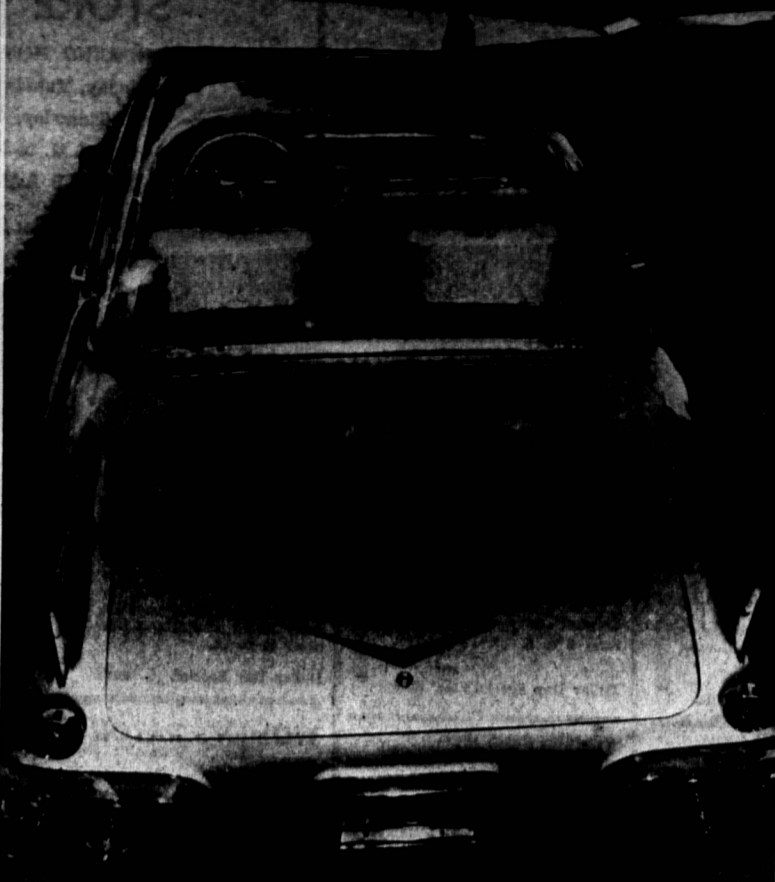

Supersonic Arrow Aircraft Is Put On View At Toronto

TORONTO (CP) — Avro Aircraft Limited Friday put on view the supersonic Arrow. The 1,200-mile-an-hour plane, which has not yet been flown, was unveiled at the company's suburban Malton plant by Defence Minister Peck. The Arrow has a long needle nose, bat wings and a high tail. It much resembles the American B-59 supersonic bomber and is in some respects a smaller edition of the RAF's delta winged Vulcan bomber. Mr. Peck said the unveiling is an significant milestone in Canadian aviation as the first aircraft flight in the British Commonwealth by Hon. J. A. D. McCurdy, 50 years ago. However, it would be "some years" before the Arrow would be available for operational use.
