Aid To U.S. In South Viet Nam Being Increased By 2 States

SAIGON (AP) — Three countries alongside United States forces fighting in Viet Nam and two of these are now sending a lot more men.

A fourth country, Thailand, will send a small force this summer.

South Korea has sent 24,500 men who have compiled an enviable record in action. Another division of 17,000 men in July will build up the South Korean commitment to 41,500.

Australia is moving 4,500 men to Viet Nam by plane and will complete the airlift by mid-June.

Included in this force, despite controversy in Australia, are the first draftees Australia has sent to foreign combat. Previously, all overseas Aussies were regular army volunteers.

The 4,500 Aussies will replace that country's original contingent of 1,500 men, who soon will return home. They have been in Viet Nam since August, 1965.

New Zealand has one battery of artillery here, with administrative personnel about 180 men.

Thailand has pledged to send in July or August, a Landing Ship Tanks, a coastal patrol boat, and two C-123 transport planes. The crews to man these four craft will number about 130.

Vehicle Output Figures Given

TORONTO (CP) — Canadian car makers have scheduled 16,272 units for production this week compared with 13,162 actually made last week which was shortened by the Victoria Day holiday, the Motor Vehicle Manufacturers' Association reports.

Truck production is scheduled to increase to 4,481 from 3,733 last week.

The Canadian car industry has turned out 354,071 cars so far this year against 323,866 at the same time last year. Truck production is up to 81,473 from 63,331.

Housing Policy Still Unchanged

OTTAWA (CP) — No major change in government housing policy is to be expected, Minister Nicholson told a Commons questioner when pressed for increased home-builder loans.

Reid Scott (NDP — Toronto Danforth) said there is a "drought of mortgage money" and asked whether the minister is prepared to instruct Central Mortgage and Housing Corp. to make more mortgage money available.

Mr. Nicholson did not agree with the urgency of the situation. Nor did he agree with Thomas M. Bell (PC — Saint John-Albert) who said CMHC loans in the 1960s are being "held up" since the tight-money policy of the government began.

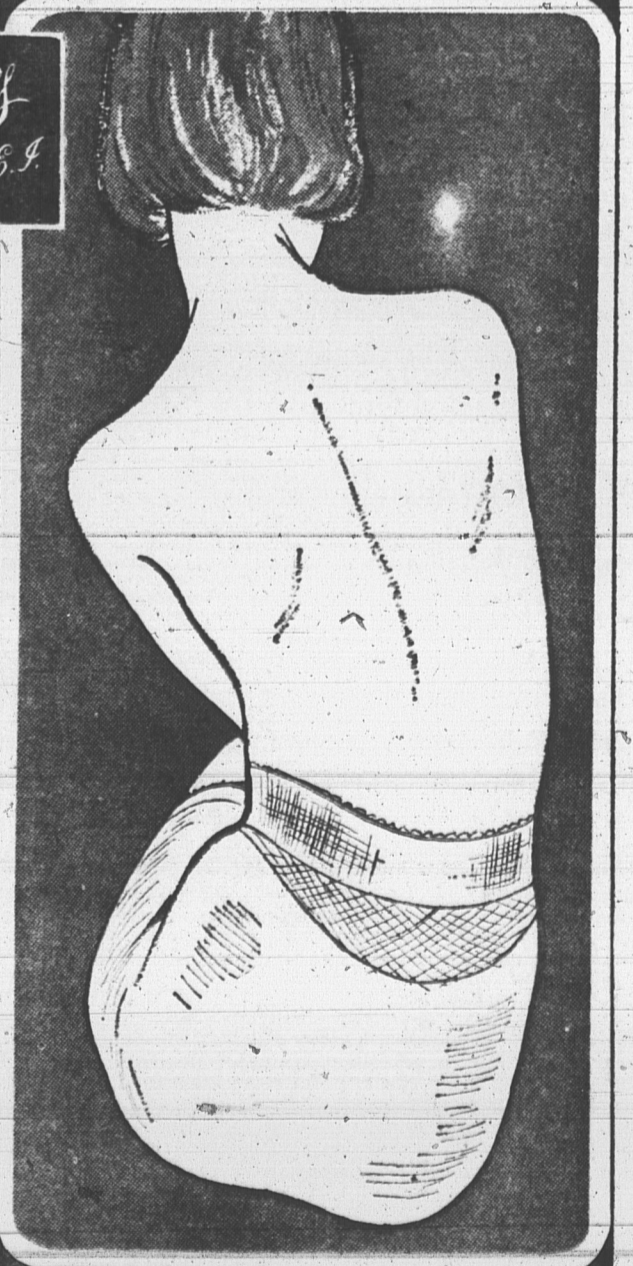
POLICE FORCE UNIFIED

PARIS (AP) — The French cabinet has approved a decree unifying the Surete Nationale (National Police) and the Parisian prefecture of police into a single national police force. 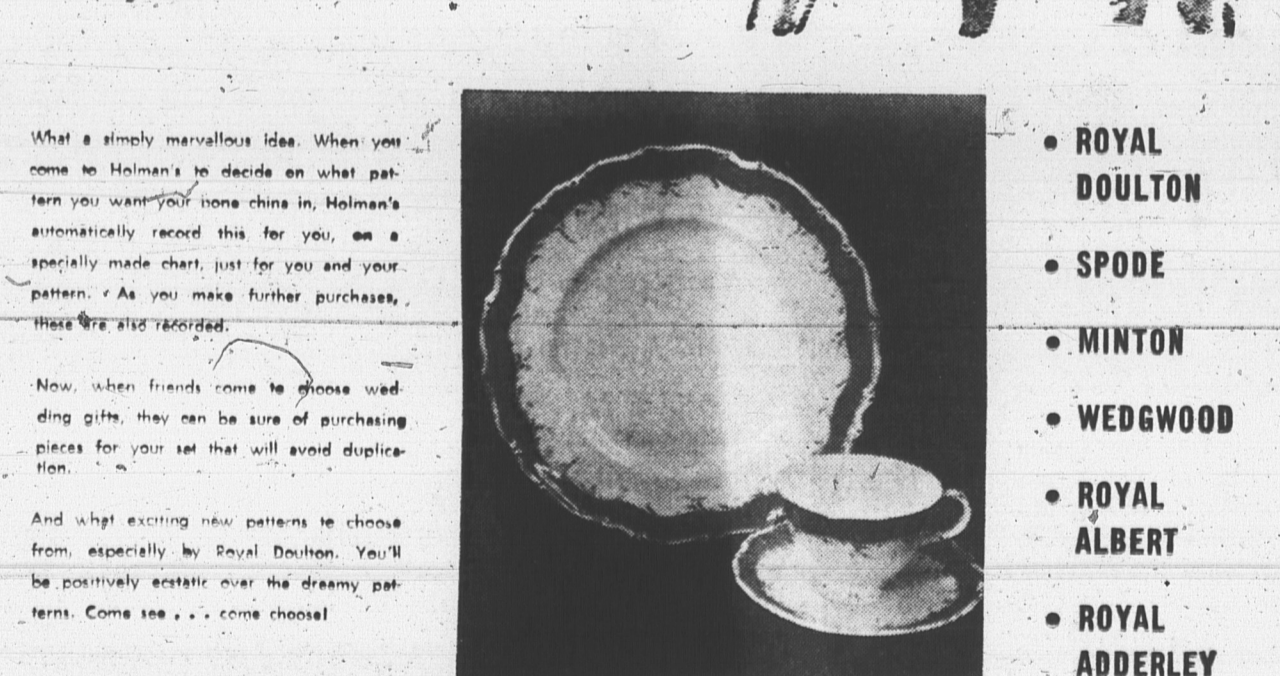
