Dominion Open 39 New Stores

TORONTO (CP) — Dominion Stores Ltd., had a net profit in the year ended March 22 of \$6,548,125 or \$4.06 a share compared with \$5,722,981 or \$3.55 a share in the preceding year, the company says in a preliminary report.

Sales reached a record \$311,688,902, an increase of more than 15 per cent.

The report also announced the retirement of J. William Horsey as chairman of the board, and the election of John A. McDougald as the new chairman.

During the year the company opened 39 new stores to bring its total across Canada to 334.

Queen Of The Gypsies Buried

LENDINARA, Italy (AP) — Mimi Rossetto, queen of the gypsies, was buried Saturday in her brightest red, green and yellow gown, with a golden rosary in her hands and a few silver coins in her coffin to pay her way to eternity.

The Lendinara town brass band preceded the coffin of the pipe-smoking, brandy-drinking Gypsy queen to Santa Sofia Roman Catholic Church, playing Chopin's Funeral March. Following the coffin were hundreds of Queen Mimi's followers from all over Europe.

The bracelet bedecked women wore their gayest dresses. The men were sprouting whiskers.

Teen-Aged Gang Leader Seized

NEW YORK (AP)—An armed teen-age Bronx gang leader was seized Sunday in a police trap. They said he admitted the shotgun killing of 17-year-old Michael Ramos.

Ramos was a prosecution witness in the recent murder trial of seven youths for the stabbing of police-coppled Michael Farmer. But police inspector John V. Halk said "there is definitely no connection between the (Ramos) death and the Farmer case."

Half said Ramon Serra, 17, chief of the Egyptian Crowds, admitted shooting Ramos to death with a shotgun in a Bronx candy store Saturday night.

Ramos, a leader of the Kingsmen gang, had boasted of taking over in the Crown's territory, Halk said. He described the slain youth as a cocky braggart.

Serra was captured on a Bronx street as he kept an appointment with a 14-year-old girl friend who was present at the shooting.

Detectives had questioned the girl and then gone to her home. Serra phoned. The girl told him there were no police present and she made the appointment.

Lloyd Urges Early Decision On Red Plan

LONDON (Reuters) — Foreign Secretary Lloyd says Britain, the United States and France must consider "as quickly as possible" Russia's latest condition for staging pre-summit East-West negotiations.

Speaking at Cambridge Sunday Lloyd said he had read a new Soviet note handed to the Western envoys Saturday in Moscow.

The Soviet message proposed that Poland and Czechoslovakia join Russia, the United States, Britain and France in talks at ambassador level in Moscow to prepare for a full East-West conference at the summit.

They will not shave for six months in mourning.

Mimi, born in Bilbao, Spain, 56 years ago, died Tuesday.

Lloyd said the note appeared to offer a choice — "either preparation by separate meetings or if there is to be a joint meeting, the Soviet Union says that for reasons of their prestige they must have Poland and Czechoslovakia there also."

DIPLOMATIC TALKS

LONDON (AP) — Britain announced Monday that Prime Minister Abdul Magid Kubar of Libya will visit London Saturday for talks on North Africa, the Middle East and further British financial aid for the desert Arab kingdom. One purpose of the talks is to try to block the spread of Russian influence in his country.
