### Canadian Gets Appointment

PARIS (Reuters) — Dr. William M. Cameron, director of oceanographic research for the Canadian department of mines

and technical survey, has been named chairman of the 40-nation Intergovernmental oceanographic commission. It was announced here.

The announcement came from the Paris headquarters of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization.

Dr. Cameron, 47, of Ottawa, succeeds the late Dr. Angus Brumm, leading Danish marine biologist, who died last December two months after his election as the commission's first chairman.

### Easter Week Services Planned By City Churches

With the Easter season near at hand, churches throughout Charlotteville will mark the end of Lent and the day of the resurrection with special services and music appropriate to the season.

Trinity Church will hold a communion service at 11 a.m. on Good Friday, featuring selections from the cantata "Olivet to Calvary." An interdenominational service of meditation will be held from three to four o'clock in the afternoon with music by Trinity Church choir and worship conducted by the ministers of the Charlotteville churches.

Handel's Alleluia Chorus by the senior girls choir will be featured in the morning service on Easter Sunday, with the sermon by Rev. John Ball on "A Walk in the Garden." Rev. R.S. Latimer will preach at the evening service, and music will be played by the senior choir and the junior girls choir.

MIDNIGHT MASS St. Dunstan's Basilica will have the Solemn Mass of the Resurrection at midnight Saturday, preceded by the Saturday Vigil service. Masses on Sunday will be at 8 a.m. with a Solemn Pontifical Mass at 11 a.m.

On Holy Thursday there will be a Pontifical Low Mass at 8 a.m. with the blessing of the oil. There will be masses at 10 a.m. and 12 p.m. with a Solemn Mass at 7:30 p.m. The main Good Friday service will take place at three p.m., with the stations of the cross and sermon at 7:30.

The First Baptist Church will have the first observation of Easter Sunday with a sunrise service at 7:30 a.m. with a speaker and Eileen Macdonald as soloist.

The Easter morning service, entitled "Conqueror of Sin and Death," will begin at 11 a.m. Special music will include "Divine Redeemer" by Guntod, "The Holy City" by Adams sung by Mrs. Douglas McKinney, and a solo by Sister Mary, "When It's Easter Sunday Morning" by O'Hara.

CAROL SERVICE The Easter carol service will be held at 7 p.m. with selections by the church choir, the senior girls choir and senior, and a meditation on "Our Everlasting Home" by Guntod. The service will include an organ recital by William Elliott, formerly of Yale.

The Church of the Most Holy Redeemer will have Saturday Vigil services at 11:30 p.m. followed by Solemn High Mass at midnight. Morning services will be at 8 a.m. and 10 a.m. on Holy Thursday will be at 4 p.m. and 5:45 p.m. with a Solemn High Mass at 8 p.m.

St. Peter's Cathedral will hold the celebration of the Holy Eucharist at 7 a.m. and 8 a.m. on Sunday, with Matins at 9 a.m. A procession and choral chanting will be held at 11 a.m. with the musical setting by Charles Wood. Evensong, processions and solemn Te Deum by Lily McJohn will end the day's services at 7 p.m. The Magnificat and Nine Lessons will be by Healy Willis.

FRIDAY'S SERVICES Friday's services will include Matins and Litany at 10 a.m. processions and meditation at an address at 11, devotions on the cross at 3, children's service at 4, and meditation at 7 p.m. Easter Eve services will be at 10 a.m. with the litany, and evensong at 4 p.m.

The Kirk of St. James will have the celebration of Holy

communion at 11 a.m. on Easter Sunday. Music will include the choral Introit "Begn My Soul Some Heavenly Theme" by the junior choir, "The Festival Anthem" and "Blessed Be The Lord And Father Of Our Lord Jesus Christ" with solo by Barbara Rogers and R. M. Reymond.

The Vesper Order of the Seven and of Easter Lessons will be held at 7 p.m. with passages being read by the laymen from the gospels, epistles and Apocalypse. Music will include the anthem "The Sifts In O'er" by the senior girls choir, "I Know My Redeemer Liveth" and the Alleluia Chorus from Handel's Messiah.

SPECIAL CANTATA A special Easter Cantata will compose the evening service at Central Christian Church, entitled "The Road to Victory." The cantata proceeds from the triumphal entry through the solemnity of the resurrection, with scripture narration and music by the choir. The morning service will feature a special message.

St. Paul's Anglican Church will hold communion services at 8 and 11 a.m. on Sunday, with Handel's Alleluia chorus at the 11 a.m. service. The service of evening prayer at 7 p.m. will include the anthem "The Sifts In O'er." Services on Good Friday are at 10 a.m. and 8 p.m.

Services at Calvary Temple on Sunday will place special emphasis on the resurrection. Main selections by the choir will include "Christ Arose" and "Death Has No Tares." The four resurrection litanies are the VIGIL SERVICES.

St. Paul's X Church in Paradise will have matins and vespers at 10:45 on Saturday night, followed by midnight mass. Solemn Mass will be held at the regular time. The liturgical service for Good Friday will be at 8 p.m. On Holy Thursday there will be an evening Mass for the children, at 8 p.m. with procession at 8:30.

Spring Park United Church will hold services at 11 a.m. on Sunday, with Rev. Clayton Lewis preaching on the theme "Is Yours Indeed?" This Joyful Easter! will be rendered by the junior choir. The service will be at the senior choir.

ZION PRESBYTERIAN Worship services on Sunday at Zion Presbyterian Church at 11 a.m. and 8 p.m. will emphasize the Easter theme throughout. Special music by the senior girls' choir will include "This Joyful Easter!," a traditional Dutch melody, and a boy's trio composed of Allan Stewart, Allan Balderston, and Kenneth Murphy singing "Children of Jerusalem" by Healy.

In the evening, Sylvia Phillips will be heard in the spiritual "Were You There When They Crucified My Lord?" by Rev. Donald Campbell, minister. The joyous "The Resurrection" will be the theme of the morning, and "The Conversion of a Skeptic" in the evening.

MORNING MESSAGE The morning message for the Charlotteville Bible Chapel will be "The Power of His Resurrection." The conclusion of a three-month series of messages on "The Journey of Israel" to the wilderness, the crossing of the Jordan, will compose the evening service.

Salvation Army services on Sunday will include a special sunrise service at 6 a.m. and Easter breakfast.

Dark Row United Church will have services at 11 a.m.

and 7 p.m. on Sunday, with special Easter music. Music by the senior, intermediate and junior choirs will be featured at the evening service. A communion service and confirmation of new members will be held on Good Friday morning.

Journalistic Awards Made NEW YORK (AP) — The Overseas Press Club of America has presented Journalism awards to 16 individuals and citations to 18 others.

Winner of the club's annual George Polk Memorial Award for the best reporting in any medium, requiring "exceptional courage and enterprise abroad" was Dickie Chapelle, a New York free-lancer.

A lifetime award and a \$500 prize were given for her coverage of the fighting in South Viet Nam, where she made several parachute jumps into enemy territory.

A citation went to Sydney Gruson of New York Times for his reporting on the Berlin situation.

Gruson, 45, began his newspaper career with the Canadian Press. He worked with CP in Toronto, Montreal, New York and London and left to join the New York Times in 1953. His new is stationed in Bonn. His brother, Will, is with the Canadian Press in Toronto.

Ont. Relaxes Drinking Laws TORONTO (CP) — Premier Roberts has relaxed Ontario's drinking laws.

The premier announced: 1. Hotels will be permitted to serve liquor in rooms.

2. Cocktail bars will be permitted to prepare and serve liquor to 1 a.m.—on weekdays to bring them in line with dining rooms.

3. Private clubs in dry areas may be licensed.

4. Tourist establishments in unorganized areas and summer resorts will be eligible for licensing and arrangements will be made for the purchase of alcoholic beverages in summer resort areas.

5. Public houses and taverns will be able to sell the liquor licence board for different opening hours, providing they are not open more than 12 consecutive hours. At present they are open at noon.

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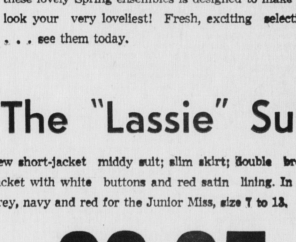

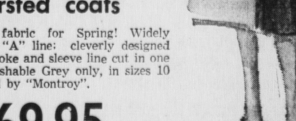
