

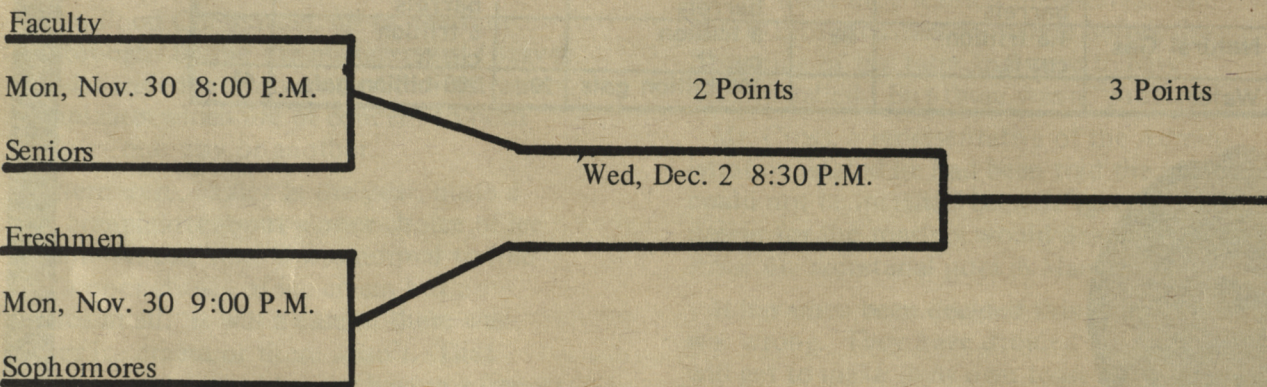

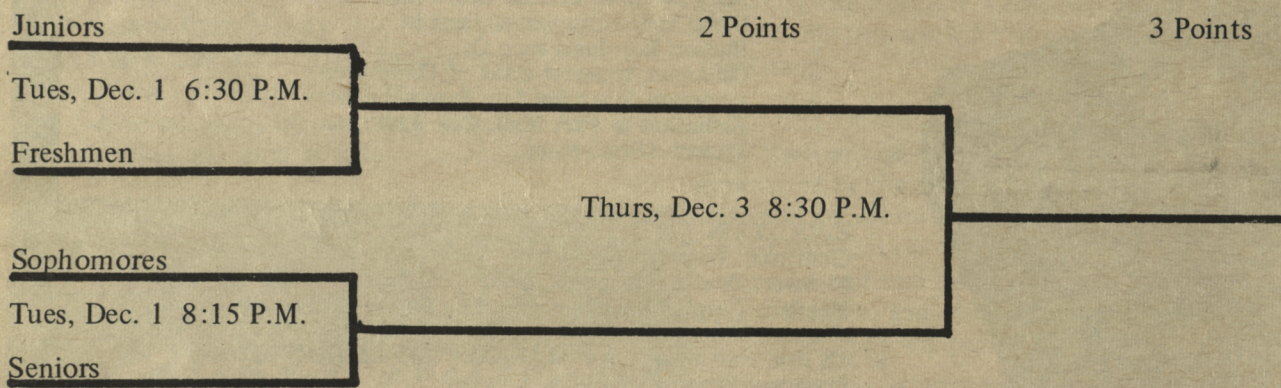

Here is a schedule of the games to take place, with the number of points the winning team will receive:

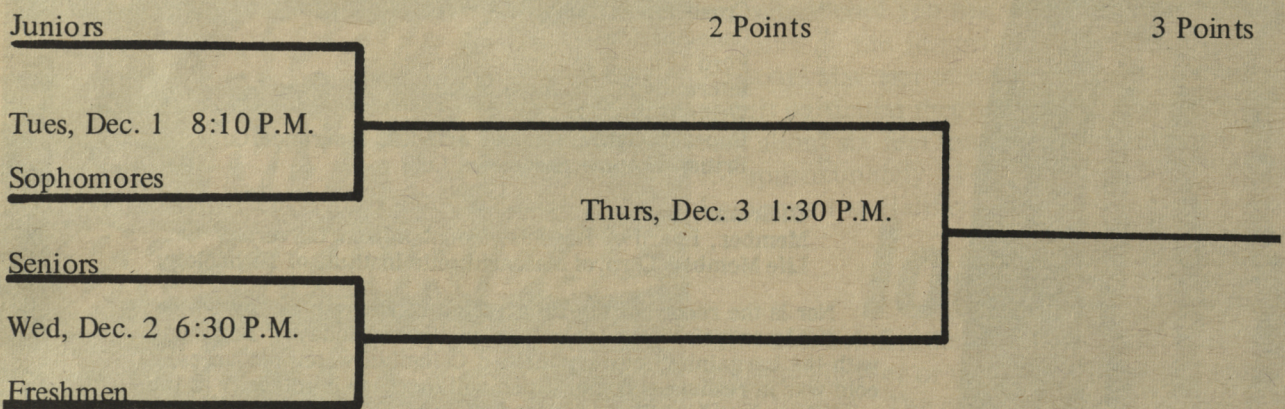

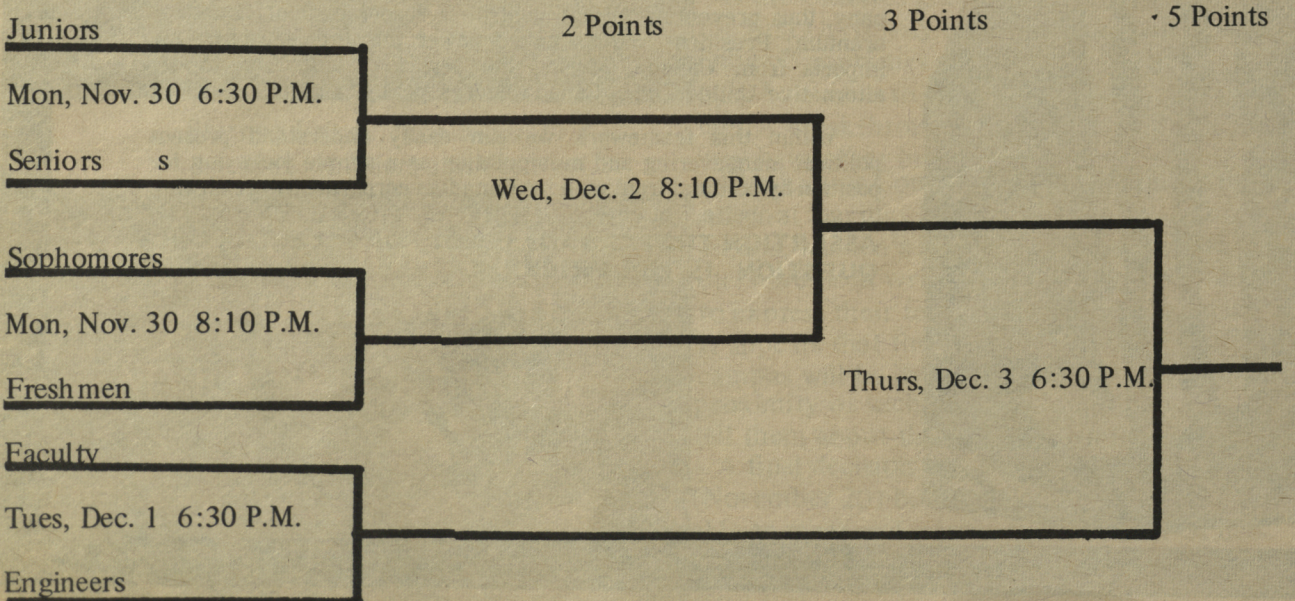
INTRAMURAL BASKETBALL

The first period was scoreless with both teams missing great chances to score. Dewar the Beothuks goal tender stopped 10 shots, many of which came from close in. Ladner handled 7 shots coming up with the big stop on McCallum who let go with a shot that looked like a sure goal.

In the second period the Panthers bombarded Dewar with 27 shots as they completely bedazzled the Beothuks with accurate passing and positional play. The winning goal came at 4:58 on a power play with Luc Bedard pulling the trigger. The play was started by Jim MacDonald who carried the puck into the Memorial zone passing it back to the point to Bedard who let go with a blistering slapshot that caught the bottom corner. The Panthers continued to apply pressure but they were unable to get the puck by Dewar.

In the third period play slowed down considerably as both teams began to show the effects of two games in 18 hours. The Panthers scored the only goal of the period when Billy Weatherbie fired home a goal, pass from Ralph McCully. Howard Ellis picked up an assist on the goal. In the latter half of the period the Panthers checked the Beothuks all over the ice, not allowing them a chance to ruin Ladner's shutout.

Next games for the Panthers will be next weekend in Antigonish against St. F.X. and Halifax against Dalhousie Tigers.
