Boeing advanced 8 1/2 to 176 1/2 on news that it had received an order from Pan American World Airways for 25 jets at a cost of \$525,000,000, one of the biggest plane orders in history.

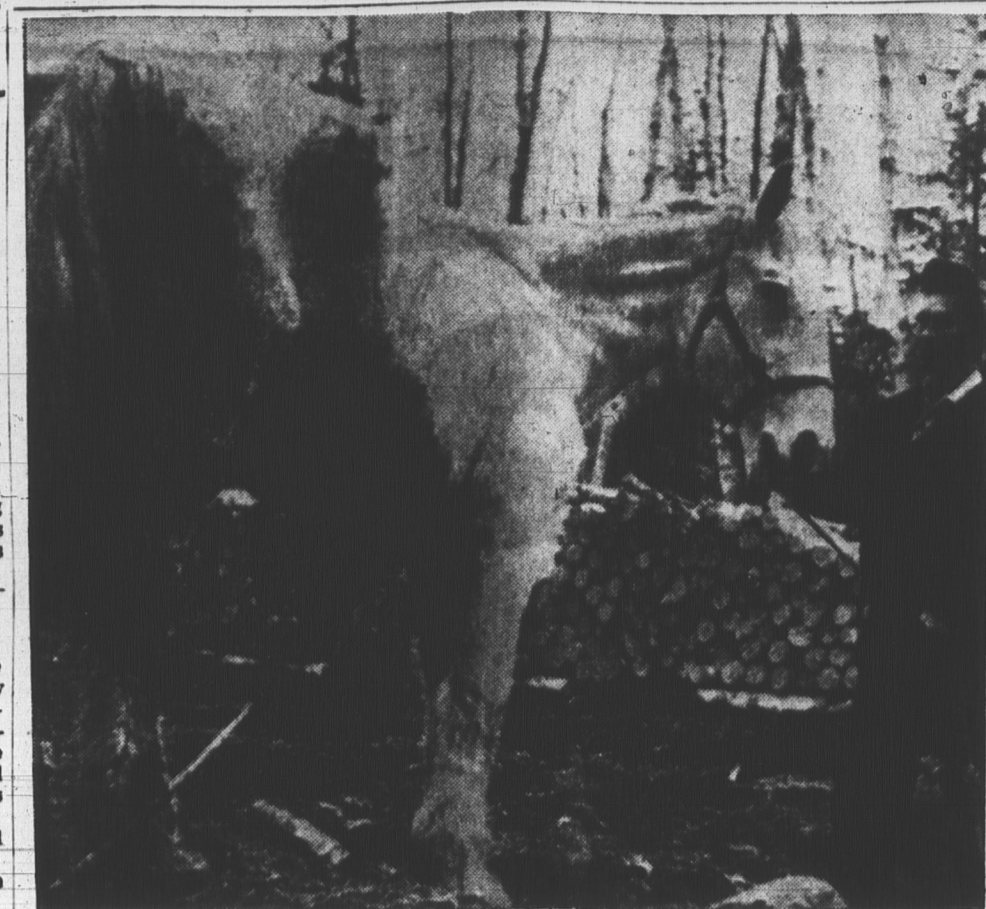
