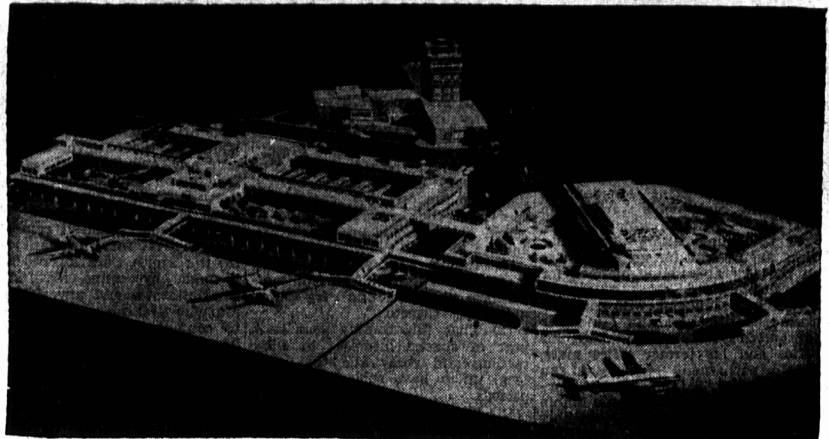

Expect 15,000 For Gavilan, Bratton Fight

CHICAGO, (AP) — The International Boxing Club which has had its share of box-office busts may have a pleasant surprise in Friday night's Kid Gavilan-Johnny Bratton welterweight title bout at Chicago Stadium.

The IBC predicts a crowd of upwards 15,000 in the 19,400-seat stadium for this third meet-

ing of the hard-hitting 147-pounder.

With a \$15 top and television blacked out locally while carried nationally, a capacity crowd may develop.

When Gavilan exploded the Chuck Davey myth at the stadium Feb. 11, a crowd of 17,450 paid \$275,454, tops for a welterweight title bout. Ironically, this was one of the most one-sided championship bouts in years.

Artistically, Gavilan's defence against Bratton figures to be one of the best title shows the IBC has staged here since Sugar Ray Robinson-Jake LaMotta middle-weight brawl in February, 1951. These are two ring gamecocks,

Wants Bout With Fight Winner

SYRACUSE, N. Y., (AP)—A Syracuse promoter said Wednesday he had offered \$50,000 guarantee to the winner of Friday night's championship welterweight fight each featuring an ability to pour out a torrent of punches in vicious flurries. Each has a knockout punch. Gavilan scoring 27 KOs in his 95 victories, 13 defeats and four draws and Bratton 32 in a 59-20-3 record.

Makes Demand For Baseball To Clean House

LONDON, (AP)—Emanuel Celler, New York Democratic Congressman who investigated baseball in 1950, demanded Tuesday that baseball "clean house" or face repressive legislation.

Celler laid down a program for the major leagues to follow after hearing of the U. S. Supreme Court decision declaring professional baseball exempt from federal anti-trust laws because it is a sport.

In London en route to India to study refugee problems, he said: "First, the reserve clause must be softened. Binding a player for his entire baseball life, even

against his will, is peonage. No contract should be for more than five years without mutual consent."

The Supreme Court decision was announced Monday in Washington on three cases involving the reserve clause. This clause, a part of the standard player contract, gives the club sole right to negotiate for the player's services in subsequent years.

As chairman of the House of Representatives judiciary committee in 1950, Celler led a long investigation of major league baseball.

The New Yorker criticized the geography of the major leagues. The present set-up "must be remedied . . . Big League teams should be established farther west than the Mississippi river, or a new Pacific coast big league must be established to embrace cities such as Los Angeles and San Francisco."
