



ARRIVES WITH STEEL CARGO

The S.S. Irish Willow arrived in Charlottetown from the United Kingdom about 2.30 Sunday afternoon under charter to Manchester Lines with a cargo of 440 tons of steel pipe for Parkdale. She docked at the Railway Wharf.

Furness-Withy are the general agents and Buntain, Bell and Co. local agents for the line. The steel was supplied by Stanton Pipe and was loaded at Preston, north of Manchester. The Irish Willow is a liner de-

signed to pass through the Great Lakes with their 14 foot draft canals. She can carry about 3,000 tons of cargo and is approximately 240 feet in length. She is owned by the Irish line.

Says Christian Principles Can Down Red Propaganda

"If we in the West will but dedicate ourselves to the unselfish principles of Christ, and put them into practice in our relations with our fellowmen, no Communist will be able to point the finger of scorn or condemnation at us." Rev. John Sutherland Bonnell, D.D., pastor of New York's fifth Avenue Presbyterian Church told the congregation attending the eleven o'clock service in Charlottetown's Trinity United Church yesterday morning.

Minister of one of America's leading Presbyterian churches for the past twenty-four years, Dr. Bonnell entitled his discourse "The Battle For Russia's Soul." Earlier this year he had headed a committee of American churchmen who toured the Middle East and Russia under the sponsorship of the International Council of Christians and Jews. "Too often in our Western civilization," he said, "the lives of men and women are guided by a far lower concept" what's in it for me?

"If we but live by the highest we know, the spiritual teachings of Our Lord, Christianity will witness the coming of the Divine Kingdom with such power as will be the wonder of the world." NOTES IMPROVEMENT Dr. Bonnell said that this summer he had witnessed a vast improvement in the religious situation in Russia in comparison to that which he had found there on a previous visit 24 years ago. "At that time," he said, "I visited a half-dozen churches that had been transformed into anti-religious museums where the Christian faith was caricatured; where the Bible was ridiculed as a barrier to Science; where Christianity was alluded to as a promoter of ignorance and superstition."

Every conceivable impediment was employed by the government to undermine the church and religion, the speaker noted. "In 1932," Dr. Bonnell continued, "the President of the Militant Atheists, Yaroslavsky, addressing the 17th annual All-Russian Party Congress said: 'Give us five more years and we will wipe out every vestige of religion in Russia. By 1937 we shall have accomplished the liquidation of God.' Observing that the Congress rang with applause at this statement, the New York minister noted that 1937 came and went and God was not liquidated. "Now, 26 years after Yaroslavsky's prophecy, the Christian Church is more deeply entrenched
