Causeway Feasibility Report Is Claimed Not Yet Complete

Queens County Liberal candidate Allison Gillis contended last night that the causeway feasibility report has not been completed and will not be completed for some time.

He based his contention on the fact that as late as April 4 a federal cabinet minister said in the House of Commons that wave measurement equipment was damaged last winter and measurements could not continue until the ice had cleared. Mr. Gillis said the ice has not yet cleared, and therefore the feasibility report cannot be completed for some time.

"The Honorable Prime Minister and his colleagues," he said, "are again attempting to buy the four federal seats of this province with the promise to do something they do not yet have a feasibility report on."
