MIND-READING

There are times when a defender should be able to read declarer's mind and know exactly what his problem is.

South dealer. Both sides vulnerable.

Bridge hand diagram showing cards for South, North, East, and West.

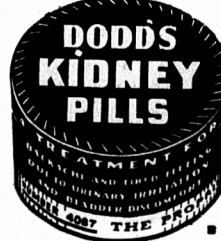
The bidding: South West North East

1 ♠ Pass 1 ♣ Pass 2 NT 3 NT (final bid)

West made his natural opening lead, the spade queen, and, immediately, declarer had to reach a decision.

The club finesse could always be taken, so South properly decided to investigate the diamond suit first.

If East had carefully considered the bidding and had looked at the cards in his own hand and in dum-



my, while realizing that the opening lead showed a certain spade holding in West's hand, he might have reconstructed exactly what was going through South's mind in respect to alternative lines of play.

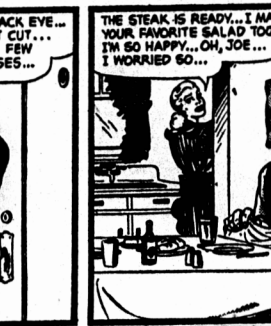

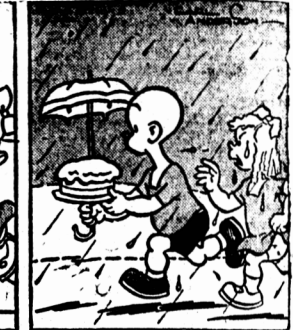

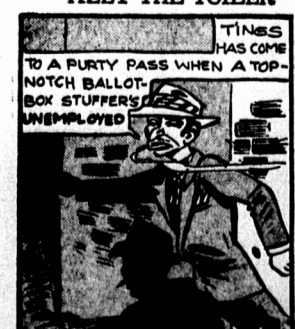
