Cubans Hail More Arms From Russia

HAVANA (AP)—The Cuban Press has applauded the Soviet agreement to supply more military aid and warned that any invasion by the United States would be "a suicidal danger world peace."

The government-controlled newspaper reported under banner headlines that further military shipments were coming from Russia along with dispatches from Washington by the official news agency pressa Latina announcing "Yankee war."

The agency said that should Washington follow suggestions by several U.S. senators for an invasion of Cuba "peace would stand endangered."

It is said that Cuba, already considered Latin America's most up-to-date army, would be bolstered in view of threats from imperialist aggressive circles.

END OF OPERATION: Diplomatic sources said the Moscow announcement Sunday of military aid, in the form of hardware and expert advisors on how to use it, marked the end rather than the beginning of the Russian drive.

These circles said that the Soviet military equipment so far has been in the form of artillery aiming devices—some of it 15 years old.

Sees Great Britain Forced To Become Member Of ECM

By GREG MACDONALD Canadian Press Staff Writer. Great Britain cannot afford to ignore the European Common Market, says Dr. R. V. Yoh, president of B.F. Goodrich Canada Ltd.

Speaking to reporters before addressing the annual meeting of the Business Newspapers Association here, Dr. Yoh said Britain will be in serious economic trouble if she does not become a member of the Common Market.

Dr. Yoh recently returned from a visit to six European countries as part of a B.F. Goodrich production company mission inquiring into government-labor-management relations.

He said he received the impression while in England that if Britain does not become a member of the Common Market then she will likely "invest heavily in it as she cannot possibly ignore it."

Dr. Yoh added it is inevitable that there will be a common market between Canada and the United States and "in the long run there must be a world common market among western hemisphere countries."

Speaking later to the BNA meeting, Dr. Yoh said he felt it pertinent to report what he saw in Western Europe on how labor and management and government attack their joint problems.

USE INFORMATION "All the countries," Dr. Yoh said, "prepare economic information, usually by a 13-man advisory committee."

Dr. Yoh said that the information is used to determine productivity accomplishments of the past.

Goals are set and broad encompassing plans are laid in joint government-labor-management agreement, or at least understanding, so that each segment may improve its proper part.

Also, labor negotiations are industry-wide, not by individual companies or plant locations. Employers are organized.

He told workers at the August-Thyssen steel mill at Duisburg that his Ruhr district now felt only sympathy and satisfaction on the part of France for today our two countries have achieved solidarity.
