Man Pleads Guilty To Theft Of Cattle

SUMMERSIDE — A St. Chrysostom man, Andrew Theodore Gallant, entered a plea of guilty to a charge of theft of a heifer and a steer before Magistrate W. Chester S. MacDonald in Prince County Court yesterday morning.

A Kinkora resident, Everett Martin Mulligan, charged with knowingly permitting a chemical substance to enter water inhabited by fish, entered a plea of not guilty and had his case adjourned to Sept. 28.

Two persons, James William Crafer, Baltic, and Arnold Joseph Cameron, Miscouche, were each fined \$50 and costs on separate charges of driving while their licenses were suspended.

Magistrate MacDonald adjourned the case of Willard-Coles of New London, charged with impaired driving, to Sept. 23 for decision. The accused, represented by J. Melville Campbell, pleaded not guilty to the charge at an earlier hearing.

On a similar charge, Lloyd James Murphy of Carleton Place pleaded not guilty and had his case adjourned to Oct. 14.

Four persons appeared on charges of speeding and were each fined \$10 and costs. Fined were Thomas Coughlin, MacNeils Mills; Edward Arsenault, Kensington; J. Anthony Arsenault, Abram's-Village; Richard Chapman, RCAF Summerside.

Four Summerside men, George Joseph Grady, Cecil Arsenault, Robert Gaudet and John Henry Richard, who had entered a plea of guilty to similar charges of possession of stolen goods, namely a combination gasoline engine and water pump valued at more than \$50, had their cases adjourned to Sept. 21 to set a date for hearing.

Ball for each of the accused was set at \$100 cash or \$1,000 property in two sureties of \$500 each.

CHARGE OF THEFT A St. Eleanor's youth, Joseph Alfred Gallant, who had been given a deferred sentence in July when he pleaded guilty to a charge of theft of a watch valued at more than \$50, was fined \$25 and costs.

Ernest Joseph Lennox of Wellington was fined \$10 and costs for squelching tires.

A Summerside man, Ronald Joseph Gaudet, was fined \$10 an costs for operating a vehicle with insufficient equipment.

A similar fine was assessed Wayne Preston Baird of Seaview on a charge of failing to yield the right of way.

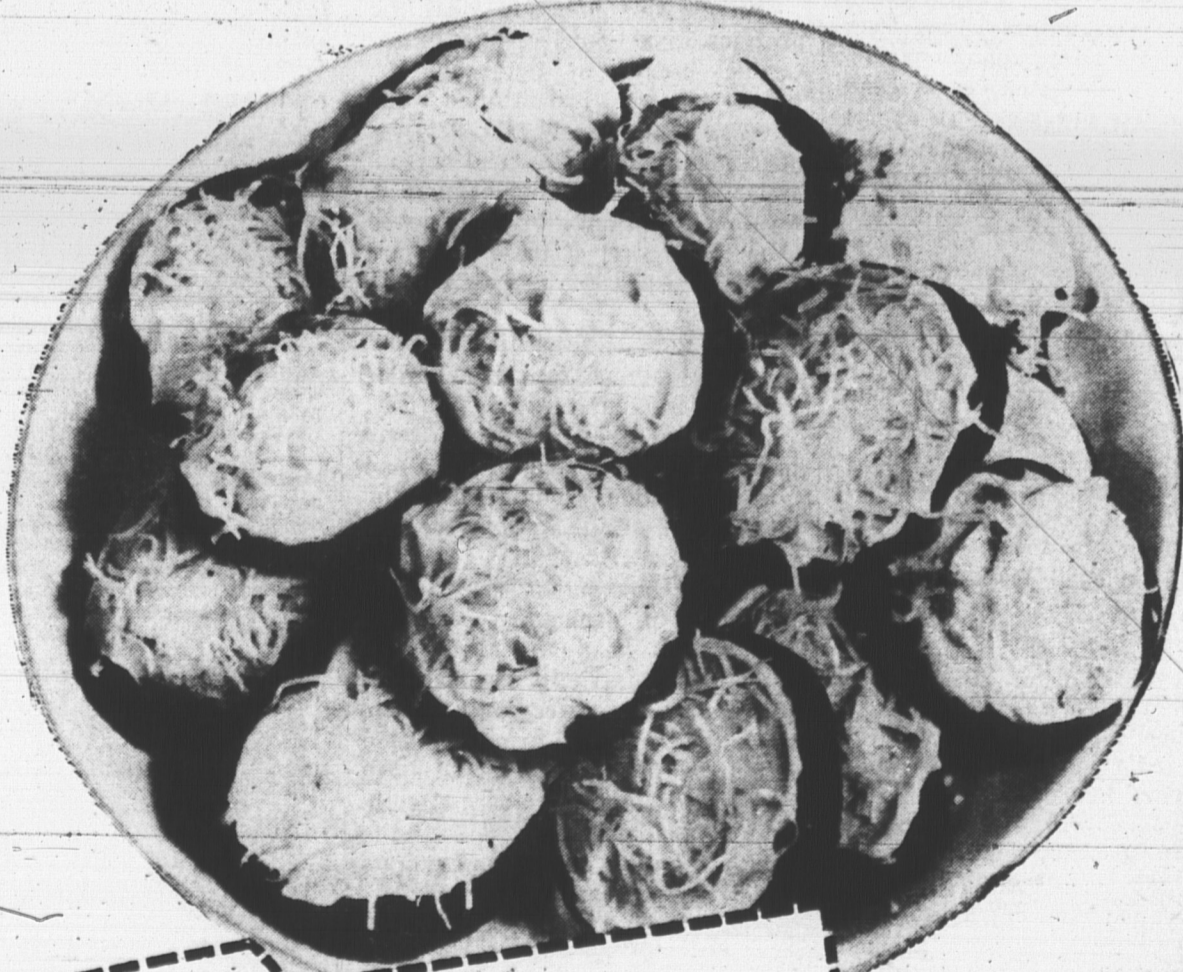
Water Level Causes Concern Dropping water levels in wells in the province are causing concern for the water supply here.
