ferent, after being made the cheese is placed in a curing room at the factory for a period of ten days at 58 degrees F.

When the cheese arrives at the storage a sample box is taken from each vat number and placed in the grading room at a temperature of 60 degrees F.

The two check testers have been appointed to carry out the work of testing and checking milk and cream samples which are taken at the dairy manufacturing plants of the Province.

Wash the machine after each milking. Rinse with cold or lukewarm water, then brush all parts, using warm water (140 degrees F.) containing a soda washing powder.

Between milkings the test cup assembly is stored on the rack and the tubes filled with a recommended chlorine or lye solution.

CREAM SEPARATOR Cream separators require careful attention. If left unwashed, the bacteria present may multiply to enormous numbers and these will contaminate the cream of the next separating.
