NS Plans Complete Probe Of Springhill Coal Area

HALIFAX (CP)—Prime Minister E. A. Manson said Wednesday the Nova Scotia mines department will make a complete survey of the quality and quantity of coal reserves at Springhill, N.S.

Mr. Manson said two drilling rigs will begin to bore the rich Cumberland County coal fields in about two weeks.

Meanwhile, the mines department is amassing all available geological information on coal in the area. The data, some which dates back to 1912, has been collected by the mines department and Dominion Steel and Coal Corporation, former Springhill coal operators.

Mr. Manson said it will be used in appraising the coal fields, which have produced millions of tons since they were opened in the 19th century.

LAST MINE CLOSED
Springhill's last mine, the 14,000-foot deep No. 2 colliery, was closed by a Desco safety reasons after an underground upheaval Oct. 23 claimed 75 miners. The mine, operated by a Desco subsidiary, Cumberland Railway and Coal Company, produced about 450,000 tons of coal a year.

Mine manager George Calder said Wednesday only a small maintenance crew is working in the shaft now.

Mr. Manson said he hopes the survey will reveal the best places for a possible new mine being considered by an independent Cumberland County group and "two or three others."

Representatives of the four-man group met with Mr. Manson Monday. They have decided to postpone active exploration work until completion of the survey.

A spokesman for the unidentified group said earlier that an application has been made to the Nova Scotia government to mine coal at Springhill.

STRIPPED SURFACE
Bulldozers stripped topsoil from a seam about one-half mile from the Cumberland Company's property.

Deputy Mines Minister Dr. J. P. Nowlan said surface rights could be leased without the government's approval, but a permit was necessary for actual digging.

An Amherst source said the four men had "substantial financial backing." He said they were "confident" that a profitable operation could be undertaken.

It has been indicated since that about 75 men would be employed in the mine proposed by the group. No. 2 colliery, one of the deepest in North America, employed about 800.

The group has purchased a 35-acre field from a private landholder.

Mining has been the economic mainstay of the town of 6,000 since coal was discovered there in 1833.

Former Island Herd Sire Wins Top Jersey Award

Edgelea Beacon Jester Standard—121953—bred by Alfred Bagg and Sons, at Edgelea, Ontario, and purchased as a calf by Edison B. Mutch of North River, P. E. I., has been awarded a superior sire certificate by the Canadian Jersey Cattle Club.

Jester Standard now has 12 tested daughters that average 8,879 pounds of milk and 488 pounds of fat, with an average test of 8.44 per cent. His 11 classified daughters average 84.77 per cent.

This bull was grand champion at the Royal 6 years ago, and is the second grand champion bull at the Royal owned by Mr. Mutch, and his second champion bull to become a superior sire, an accomplishment not very often achieved by grand champion bulls.

Last year, Edgelea Beacon Jester Standard was purchased by the well known Jersey breeder, Campbell Mackay, Kingshurst Jersey Farm, Rothney, N. B.

Edgelea Beacon Jester Standard is a son of the tested sire, Brampton World Beacon, that headed the Edgelea herd for several years and sired many prize winners, and many times has won the Get of Sire. He is a son of the famous Brampton Beacon, and he is from a 900 pound daughter of Brampton Basileus.

The dam of Edgelea Beacon Jester Standard is Edgelea Jester Jannette—a cow that has five classified offspring, three of them sons—two V. G. and one Ex., and one tested daughter. As a six-year-old, Jannette produced in 365 days 12,714 pounds of milk and 691 pounds of fat. She has nine records that total 96,994 pounds of milk and 5072 pounds of fat.

YOUTH TRAINING (DAYTIME) SHORT COURSES

I **AGRICULTURE**—This four-week (day) course includes instruction in Animal Health, Animal Husbandry, Field Crops and other topics of interest. Course begins February 9, 1959.

II **EGG GRADING**—This three-week course beginning February 23, 1959, is designed to train young men and young women in the operating and management of Egg Grading Stations. Instruction is given in: Grading of Eggs, Use of Equipment, Keeping Records and Government Regulations.

III **HOMEMAKING**—This is a six-week course beginning January 26, 1959. Instruction is given in Cooking, Nutrition, Sewing, Handicrafts, Leatherwork, Home Nursing, Laundry, etc.

Young men and young women 16 years of age and older are eligible to attend these courses.

Those who must live away from home while receiving instruction and who satisfactorily complete a course will receive assistance to the extent of \$9.00 per week.
