HEAVY DAMAGES FOR LIBEL.—In the Supreme Court of Nova Scotia, on Wednesday, the jury returned a verdict of \$7,000 damages against the Dominion Telegraph Company at the suit of John Silver & Co. It was proved that the Company supplied a dispatch to the St. John Telegraph announcing the failure of the above named firm.

An important case came before Judge Papeau on the 5th inst., involving the legality of marriage, by Protestant clergymen, of Catholics. The petitioner in the case alleges that the Catholic Bishop can pronounce on validity of such marriages, and it is not a case for civil courts. In this particular case, that of Laramie vs. Dame Marguerite Evans; Rev. J. T. Beaudry, Methodist minister, performed the marriage ceremony.

A LETTER, received by Mr. W. D. Stewart last evening, reports that the steamer "Miramichi," bound for this port with a cargo of merchandise, was ashore below Quebec on the 4th inst. She was due here yesterday; but no further account of her detention has been received. A letter, also received by Mr. Stewart, states that it is the intention of the Company to put another steamer on the route for the remainder of the present season.

HAYTI advices state that General Solomon was proclaimed President on the 23rd ult.; he obtained 82 of 87 votes in the National Assembly. The Ministry has not yet been formed. Solomon issued a manifesto asking the support of the nation and recommending the people to forget past conflicts. Solomon was Secretary of Finance and Commerce under S. Rouleau and Minister Plenipotentiary to the English and French Courts under Solvaves. The Republic is tranquil, though it is feared the tranquility is superficial.
