OTAWA (CP) - External Affairs Minister Martin said in the Commons Friday negotiations began a year ago to expand Canada's exclusive fishing zones continue to be "very difficult."

He said the United States and several European countries involved in the talks are concerned about the effects of Canada's annual intention to use the straight baseline system in applying the 12-mile fishing limit. This concern was not limited to fisheries aspects.

Washington reports have indicated that the U.S. government is fearful that Canadian baseline zones would be used as a pretext by China and other Communist countries to restrict the operations of the U.S. Navy in the Gulf of Tonkin and other strategic bays.

Mr. Martin told J. Angus MacLean, former Conservative fisheries minister, that he is still hopeful the negotiations will be concluded successfully.
