Multiple Sclerosis Society Plans For Annual Meeting

The executive of the P.E.I. Chapter of the Multiple Sclerosis Society of Canada met recently at the home of Mr. Harold Hertz for its regular monthly meeting. The meeting was presided over by the acting president, Mrs. Keith MacKinnon, with the following executive present: Mrs. Louis Howatt, Jr., Secretary; Mr. Harold Hertz, Finance; Mrs. Lorne Jelley, Ways and Means; Mr. Heath Delaney, Publicity; and two visitors representing a local service club.

Mrs. Howatt, in the course of her report, read several interesting articles of correspondence. A letter from Mr. Cleland advising that copies of the article "I learned to live with Multiple Sclerosis," which appeared in a recent local magazine, were available to the Chapters. Mr. Hertz moved that 150 copies of this article be ordered. They are intended to be distributed to the members affiliated with the local chapter of the Society. A letter was also read from Mrs. G.B. Stewart offering to continue to help the Chapter by means of typing and stenciling, for which the executive is most grateful.

In the absence of Mr. Arbing the treasurer's report was given by Mr. Delaney. It revealed an up to date gross sum of \$1527.31 realized by memberships, donations, etc. The executive is most grateful for the response received from the Womens' Institutes, Church Groups, Leagues, Lodges and Service Clubs. Mr. Hertz expressed confidence that the objective of two thousand dollars will be reached before fiscal year ending in May.

Mr. Hertz informed the executive that permission had been received from the City Clerk for the Annual Tag Day and the date is set for September 12 and 13. Plans have started for the annual meeting to be held in Prince of Wales College on Wednesday evening, May 21. Answers to the following questions, asked of the Minister of Agriculture by Mr. Leo Rossiter in the Legislature, were tabled last week before the House prorogued:

(1) Give number of registered Holsteins purchased at Falconwood in the past 3 calendar years.

(2) How many were males?

(3) Give the total cost of each animal landed at Falconwood Farm.

(4) From whom were they purchased and who made the selections?

(5) Give official milk records on a yearly basis of any of these animals.

(6) Give detailed cost of milk per cwt produced at Falconwood Farm, and include items such as pasture, hay, grain produced at farm, concentrates purchased, pasteurization, labor, housing and total herd upkeep in 1957.

(7) Explain why it is necessary to pay for Veterinary services at Falconwood, when the Government has Veterinarians on the payroll.

(8) Give statement of Sales of Breeding stock from Falconwood for past year and amounts received for each animal. To whom were they sold?
