Test Drilling At Montague Bridge

...A government crew is engaged in drilling in the Montague River at the bridge to determine the depth of mud to solid rock. On the north side a depth of 42 feet was reached, and it was expected that close to the same depth would be reached on the south side. The purpose is to determine the length of piles required to build a supporting understructure to the bridge before or during the removal of the steel superstructure of the present bridge, in the process of making way for the new bridge to be constructed.

The firm of Noye and Rayner has the contract to construct a temporary bridge across the river, and it is understood that this will get underway shortly. This will be a one-lane traffic route for cars and 1/2 ton trucks only, all heavier traffic having to detour. How long the main bridge will be closed is unknown but it is certain that it will be the shortest time possible, since it is expected that preliminary work will be completed as far as possible before the actual closing of the bridge.

Churchill, President Eisenhower and the French premier later this month.

It was the first conference of all nine Commonwealth prime ministers since Churchill resumed office in October, 1951. In addition to discussing the international situation, they will review the Commonwealth economic program drawn up here last November.

Churchill First To Speak

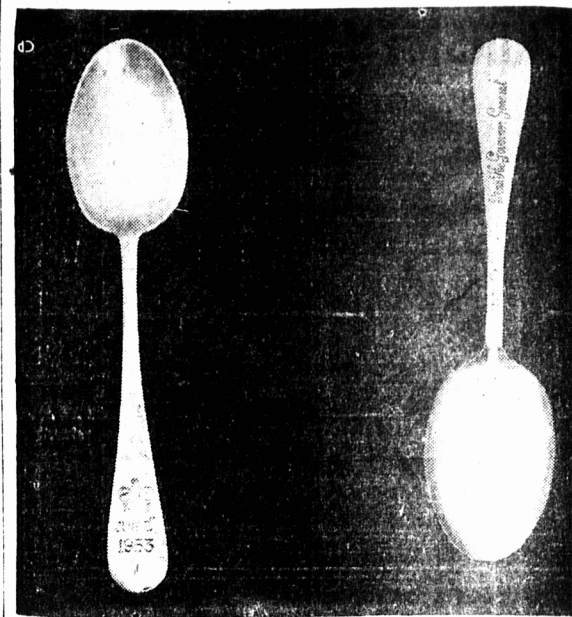
Churchill, as host, was the first to speak. He told the assemblage that the Bermuda session may be delayed because of France's political crisis but expressed the hope that the delay would be no more than a week or 10 days.

Original plans, announced just before the fall of the French government, called for a Bermuda meeting as soon after June 15 as possible.

Particular interest will be shown here toward the views of Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru of India.

Earlier 2,500 Commonwealth and colonial troops—including 750 Canadian troops—marched to the palace, where Queen Elizabeth presented them with silver Coronation medals. In the 1937 Coronation nearly 100,000 of these medals were handed out.

P. E. I. Children Get Silver Spoons



As a personal souvenir from Governor-General Vincent Massey, Canadian babies born on Coronation day, June 2, will receive one of these engraved silver spoons. It will not be necessary to apply for the souvenir. Names and addresses of the Coronation babies will be obtained from family allowance board records. The spoons then will be forwarded in gift boxes. It is expected some 1,000 spoons will be sent out. Among the lucky P. E. I. babies born Tuesday who will be receiving spoons are a boy born to Mr. and Mrs. Sterling MacEwen of Bristol, a girl, born to Mr. and Mrs. Gordon Brown, Pownal, and a boy born to Mr. and Mrs. Cyril Duote, Hunter River, RR3.

United Church Conference To Open Tuesday

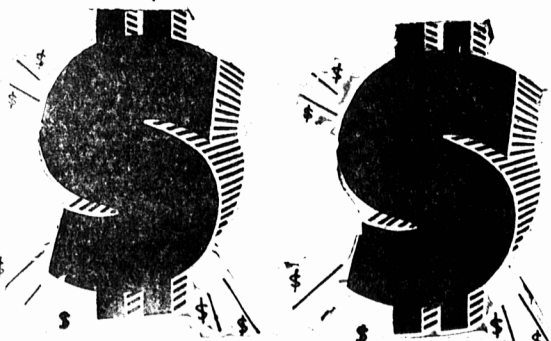

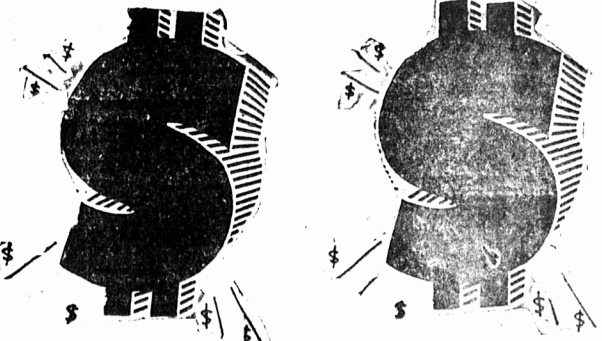
