Civic, Labor Leaders Demand Clean-up Of Perverts, Alcoholics In Montreal

MONTREAL (CP) - Civic and labor leaders, stirred by the gruesome slaying of six-year-old Raymond Trudeau, have demanded a clean-up of perverts, alcoholics and vagabonds. Municipal Judge Marchal Nantel said the courts will do everything possible to rid the park surrounding Mount Royal of all undesirable characters. He said 500 arrests had been made on Mount Royal this summer and warned gross indecency offenders that sentences will be five years in the penitentiary and a lash "to prevent a repetition of these cases".

City councillors Harry Kolber and Frank Horan complained only eight policemen are assigned to patrol the 500-acre area on Mount Royal, in the heart of the city. They asked for better lighting and the thinning out of low-lying bushes. Claude Jodoin, president of the Montreal trades and labor council, said all AFL-CIO labor bodies in the province would be asked to join a drive to take perverts off the streets. "We intend to follow it up," Mr.

Key Witness Found Hanged

ST. THOMAS, Ont. (CP) - The body of Archie Cutcut, 66-year-old Indian from the nearby Muncy reserve was found hanged in a woods eight miles west of here Wednesday.

Police said Cutcut was a key Crown witness in connection with robbery with violence charges against Donald Titchener, 21, and William Kyle, 22, of St. Thomas, due to be heard Friday. The two are currently serving reformatory terms for breaking and entering.

Native Islander Dies In Manitoba

Mr. John W. Reid, a resident of Hartney for 43 years, passed away at his home on July 5 after a lengthy illness.

Mr. Reid was born at Murray Harbor North, P. E. I. on October 7, 1888. He came west in 1904 to Brandon, Man. In 1905 he went to Deloraine, Man., where he was associated with the Beaver Lumber Co. In 1907 he went to Holmfild, Man., as manager for that company, and in 1912 he came to Hartney where he was manager for the company until 1925, when they sold out. From 1925 to 1929 he operated his own coal company. When the Hartney Consumers' Co. was formed in 1929, he was the first manager and served until 1944 when he retired.

He was a member of the United Church, and served as elder, treasurer, and as a member of the board of stewards. He was a member of the Town Council for many years. The late Mr. Reid was also a member of Mulvey L.O.L. of Hartney, and a past county master of Argus County, and had held all the offices in the lodge. He was a life member of the Provincial Grand Orange Lodge and also the Royal Black Preceptory. In 1912 he returned to Bryson, Que. where he married Ida Rea, and they returned to the West to make their home in Hartney. Surviving are his widow.

The funeral service was held in Hartney United Church on July 7, with Rev. A. Frieberg of Cardale officiating. Members of Mulvey and Elgin Orange Lodges attended the service in a body and performed the last Orange rites at the cemetery. Interment was in Hartney Riverside Cemetery. Active pallbearers were: Messrs. R. H. Gibson, J. G. McBurney, A. Galbraith, H. M. Hammond, R. Lucy and W. Spratt. Honorary pallbearers were: Messrs. W. M. Mills, J. F. Bartley, J. M. More, W. A. Death of Glen William Man

Russia Seeks Co-operation Cosmic Research

By JOHN BIRD Canadian Press Staff Writer OTTAWA (CP) - A Canadian scientist said today Russia wants to co-operate with the West in solving the mysteries of the universe.

W. S. McClenahan, head of the time service section of the Dominion observatory, said he based his statement on discussions with Russian scientists in Leningrad and Moscow in May and June. Mr. McClenahan visited Russia at the invitation of the Soviet Academy of Sciences to attend the official reopening of the Pulkovo observatory, 10 miles from Leningrad. The observatory was destroyed by the Germans during the Second World War.

The reopening ceremonies and a conference associated with the event were attended by scientists from many Western countries. The observatory they saw reopened is regarded as one of the most modern in the world. Mr. McClenahan, only Canadian government delegate at the ceremony and conference, was in Russia 16 days. Nine of them in Leningrad and the rest in Moscow.

SEEK EXCHANGE Mr. McClenahan said Russian astronomers told him they want to exchange more astronomical information with the West. He said he told them that Canada would like to receive more information from Russia on their work in the field
