Bow and Arrow Deer Hunting Growing Sport in Manitoba

WINNIEPEG (CP) — Manitoba hunters are allowed to bow and arrow hunt deer this year, provided one is taken with a bow and arrow.
Dave Dyson, president of the Manitoba Association of Archers, says this may be the reason for increased interest in the sport in the last two years.
While our association has only 75 members, there are about 400 archers in Manitoba and this number is growing all the time.
This indicated more archers were interested in hunting than in shooting at targets.
"Shooting at targets is not fast enough for young people these days, and while we have some 14- to 15-year-olds in our clubs, our biggest increase in the next few years will be adults hunting with a bow."
Dyson says the prime objective of the association, which already has five clubs in the metropolitan Winnipeg area, is to promote the sport.
"We have an exhibition team which will go out anywhere to give demonstrations and also provide instruction on the organization of a club."

New York Magazine Devotes Article To Canadian Issues

NEW YORK (AP) — Look magazine, in an article running to nine pages and entitled The Unknown Canadian, says Canada is torn by sectionalism, disaffected with its leaders and divided on vital matters.
In a report on Canada, its relationship with and feelings toward the United States and some of its national and regional issues, the magazine says the April 15 issue of the magazine "may not produce a government equal to the nation's needs."
But Canada will survive its crisis, for its people are "too proud to die," the magazine says.
The issue carrying the article is dated April 9, but it was first published Friday, the day after Prime Minister Diefenbaker's resignation.
The magazine says that a United States magazine soon would advise Canadians that the Progressive Conservative party, which is in power, is the party of the future.
The article, announced on the magazine cover with a photograph of the Red Ensign flying above a forest and the Canadian
