

# Europe Is For Students

Work this summer in the forests of Germany, on construction in Austria, on farms in Germany, Sweden, and Denmark, in Industries in France and Germany, and in hotels in Switzerland.

Jobs in Ireland, England, France, Italy, and Holland are also open by the consent of the governments of these countries to American university students coming to Europe next summer.

For twenty years students made their way across the Atlantic through A.F.S. Service to take part in the actual life of the people of these countries. The success

of this project has caused a great deal of enthusiastic interest and support both in America and Europe. Every year, the program has been expanded to include many more students and jobs. Already, many students have made application for next summer jobs. American-European Student Service (on a non-profitable basis) is offering these jobs to students for Germany, Scandinavia, England, Austria, Switzerland, France, Italy, and Spain. The jobs consist of forestry work, child care work (females only), farm work, hotel work (limited number available), construction work, and

some other more qualified jobs requiring more specialized training

The purpose of this program is to afford the student an opportunity to get into real living contact with the people and customs of Europe. In this way, a concrete effort can be made to learn something of the culture of Europe. In return for his or her work, the student will receive his or her room and board, plus a wage. However, students should keep in mind that they will be working on the European economy and wages will naturally be scaled accordingly. The working conditions (hours, safety, regulations, legal

protection, work permits) will be strictly controlled by the labor ministries of the countries involved.

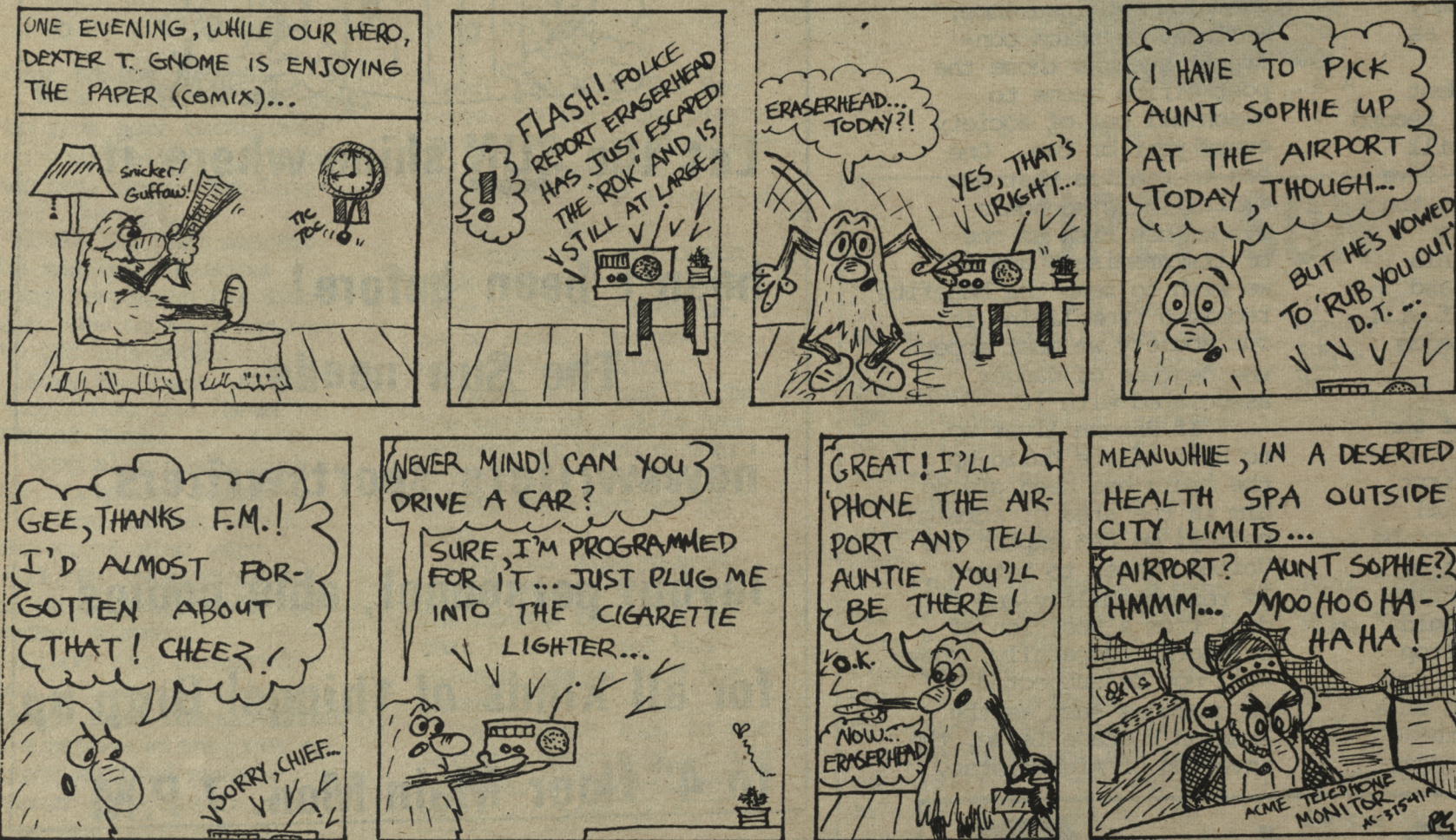
In most cases, the employers have requested especially for American students, Hence, they are particularly interested in the student and want to make the work as interesting as possible.
