Work is expected to get underway today on rebuilding the breastwork around the Victoria Park. Target date for completion is the last week in June.

Heavy winter ice and storms in recent years caused extensive damage to the old wooden breastwork and a rebuilding job was needed last year. However, in view of the big 1964 Centennial celebration and the great influx of visitors then it was decided to do a temporary patching job and let the main task wait until this year.

Reefer Shortage Should Ease By Late Today

The four-day shortage of refrigerated railway cars for potato shippers is expected to ease by late today.

Provincial government transportation officials have been advised that 55 reefers are on their way from Montreal to Moncton and should arrive in the province today, and about 80 reefers are on their way from Toronto and are expected in Moncton tonight.

Meanwhile, about 40 reefers at Cape Tormentine and 25 at Sackville were expected to be brought to the province during last night.

The reefer shortage was serious over the weekend, with about 20 of the cars coming to the province since Friday. At this time of year, potato shippers need a minimum of 40 to 50 reefers to handle potato shipments.

Maritime Area Agriculture Representatives Hold Meet

Representatives of the departments of agriculture from New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island will discuss the outlook of this year's crops this afternoon in Moncton.

The symposium, which begins at 2 p.m. in the Brunswick Hotel, is under the sponsorship of the Maritime Food Council, advisors to the Food Products Committee of the Atlantic Provinces Economic Council.

Opening remarks will be given by J. B. Pineo, president of the food council and the APEC food products committee. L.W. C. Limpert, APEC food products officer, symposium co-ordinator, will familiarize those attending with some facts about agriculture and the food industry in the Atlantic Provinces.

A panel discussion will follow, under the topic, "marketing of agricultural products in the Atlantic Provinces during the 1965 production year." Moderator of the panel will be Clarence Scarle, Centre Napan, the New Brunswick delegate to the Canadian Federation of Agriculture.

Paul - Andre Faguy, director of Emergency Measures Organization, will be guest speaker at the noon luncheon and Hon. J. David Stewart, provincial secretary, will address the dinner meeting that night.

The meeting this year will feature a guided tour of the new Confederation Memorial following the luncheon.

Delegates will be welcomed by Mayor Walter J. Cox, Charlottetown, Wednesday morning, and later he will introduce the guest speaker who will be thanked by Mayor Bruce Yeo, Montague.

The business sessions will be taken up with presentation of various reports as well as the resolutions for consideration. In the evening the guest speaker will be introduced by Summerside Councillor George Key and thanked by Kensington's Mayor Champion. Just prior to the end of the dinner meeting the site of the semi-annual meeting next fall will be announced.

Flax Grant Said Less Than Hoped

Last year, 1,000 acres of flax were grown here and an anticipated expansion of 300 acres is seen for this year's operation for a total of 1,300 acres.

Some 60 flax company shareholders were told here Saturday night that the provincial government had given the company a \$20,000 grant for this year's operation.

A company spokesman said later that the company had anticipated more than this amount from the government and as a result plans for doubling the operation from last year have been squashed.

Non-shareholders are also being sought to grow flax this year, and the spokesman said they must have their applications in before this coming Saturday in order that the operation for planting be put in motion.
