**Sales Gain Predicted For First Half Of '64**

Sixty-six per cent of 159 retailers taking part in a National Retail Merchant's Association survey predict a sales gain in the first six months of 1964 over the same period in 1963, it has been revealed. Fifty one per cent of the merchants say also that profits next year will exceed 1963 as total sales advance some five per cent and profits 10 per cent. Only five per cent anticipate a drop in sales and six per cent a drop in profits while 29 per cent say sales will hold even and 43 per cent say profits will hold even. Retail Memo, a weekly digest of retail forecasts, says "This is one of the healthiest first half sales and profit pictures disclosed by an NREMA survey in recent years". The survey revealed over half the store executives see an increase in credit sales for the first half of 1964, while 41 per cent said they would remain the same and two per cent said they would decrease. Bank's Assets At \$5 Billion

Assets showed the greater rate of growth, Mr. Currie said. The increase in activity was achieved, he said, within the framework of a steady increase in the country's money supply. Of the total \$2,209,000,000 represented personal savings in Canada, a rise of 6.2 per cent. Dividends paid out totalled \$15,678,000. Number of shareholders at the end of October was 25,816, an increase of 619.
