More! Captures Rural Ball Crown

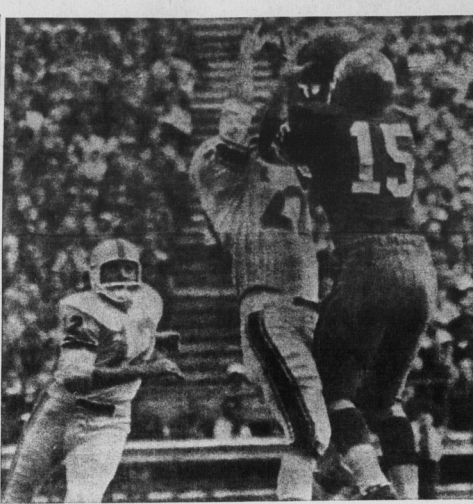
