Murder Charge
Faces Mother
MONTREAL (CP) - Mrs. Gabrielle Bouchard-Demers, 37, was charged with murder Monday in the deaths of her two young daughters and a 30-year-old man strangled Saturday with nylon stockings.
Wearing a rust-colored cloth coat and a multi-colored kerchief, she entered no plea when arraigned before Judge Omer LeGrand. Preliminary hearing was set for Dec. 1.
She appeared in court three hours after a coroner's jury found her criminally responsible for the deaths of her daughters Pauline, 3, and Andree, 2, and Wilfred Rioux, a 240-pound employee of a private detective agency.
Police testified they found the three victims when called by Mrs. Demers to her east-end flat.
Constable Nicholas Hlavaty said Mrs. Demers greeted him at the door and said: "Come in. I've committed a good one."
He said she then pointed her finger, indicating where the bodies could be found.
Rioux's body was found in the master bedroom. Medical-legal evidence at the inquest showed he had been struck on the head with a heavy blunt object before the stocking was wrapped around his neck.
The children were lying in their cribs. They had not been struck. But they had stockings around their necks and death was attributed to strangling.
A heavy frying pan and three nylon stockings were submitted as evidence by the prosecution at the court hearing.
