matic service in 1920. Three years later he was Ireland's chief diplomatic representative in Paris.

Appointed an Administrative Officer in Ireland's Department of External Affairs in 1925, three years later he became Assistant Secretary of that Department, a post he held for a decade. As Assistant Secretary he served as a member of the Irish delegation to Imperial Conference in 1929 and 1930, and as a delegate to several League of Nations Assemblies.

A number of honours have been conferred upon Honourable Mr. Murphy, including Laval University degrees of Doctor of Laws in 1952. Before he left his diplomatic post in France in 1950, he was created a Grand Officer of the French Legion of Honour.

He is married and has four children. Very Reverend Frederick J. Lynch, S.J., is a native of Bedford, P. E. I., where he was born in 1908. After attending St. Dunstan's College from 1924 to 1927,

he took up his studies for the priesthood.

Father Lynch received his seminary training at the Jesuit Novitiate in Guelph, Ontario. Ordained to the priesthood in 1940, Father Lynch has discharged various teaching duties at Loyola University in Montreal, the Jesuit Novitiate in Guelph, and the Jesuit Seminary in Toronto. Father Lynch was appointed Rector of the Toronto institution in 1947, a post he held for nearly three years.

In 1950 Father Lynch was named President of St. Mary's University in Halifax. Under his rectorship the spacious and attractive new building of St. Mary's has been constructed.

Recognized in university circles as an outstanding administrator and educator, Father Lynch is also well known for his generous hospitality. St. Dunstan's athletes and debaters particularly regard him as an alumnus who has made St. Mary's "a home away from home for Islanders."

Father Lynch is a frequent visitor to Prince Edward Island, where he has many relatives and countless friends.

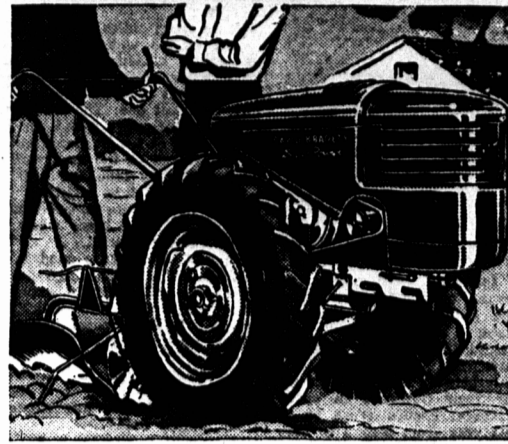
