HUNTERS' CORNER

9th Inning For Fishermen; "Batter-Up" For Hunters

The 9th inning is up for the trout fishermen and the 1st is coming up for the hunter. The game will be called for the angler at midnight on September 15th and it will be "batter up" for the hunter at one half hour before sunrise on Monday, October 1st.

There is a good hatch of black ducks this year just how good will not be definitely known until September 15th. A lot of broods are still lying doggo at the moment.

Separate Angling and Hunting licenses are also in vogue this season but the exemptions that applied to farmers, their wives, hired help and Commercial fishermen with regard to the combined Angling and Hunting license are still in force.

Non-residents do not come under the age exemption. Residents under 18 years of age may hunt if accompanied by a parent or Guardian or if in possession of a certificate in writing from a parent or Guardian stating that they are fully qualified to hunt unattended and are familiar with the rules governing the safe handling of firearms.
