Three Sentenced For Robbery
 VALLEYFIELD, Que. (CP)—Three New Brunswick men were sentenced Wednesday to jail terms ranging from three to six months after they pleaded guilty to charges of armed robbery and the possession of a firearm.
 The men—Bruce Richards, 29, Frederick Taylor, 30, and David Tait, 24, all of Saint John—were arrested Wednesday in Chateaugay, Que., for the robbery Oct. 15 of Edouard Cormier, a 65-year-old night watchman at the Chateaugay Motel.
 Cormier identified the men in court and said they had robbed him of \$86 in cash, three bottles of liquor and three cartons of cigarettes.
 Richards received a six-month sentence while Taylor and Tait each was given a three-month term.
