Eskimos Defeat Blue Bombers 25-7

EDMONTON, (CP)—Edmonton Eskimos trounced Winnipeg Blue Bombers 25-7 Saturday night on a snow-hardened field in the opening game of the Western Interprovincial Football Union best-of-three final before 15,500 chilled fans.

Playing in 23-degree weather on a wind-swept field plowed clear of a 3 1/2-inch snowfall, Eskimos romped to 6-1, 15-1 and 25-1 quarter leads before the Bombers scored their only converted touchdown in the last minute against Edmonton second-stringers.

The second game will be played in Winnipeg Wednesday afternoon and the third, if necessary, in Edmonton Saturday night.

Former Yankee President Dies

PORT CHESTER, N. Y. (AP)—Ed Barrow, the man who built the New York Yankees baseball empire as general manager and president, was in a critical condition Sunday night at the United Hospital. He is 85.

A hospital spokesman said Barrow was in a semi-coma from which he is not expected to rally. The spokesman said he has a malignancy.

Barrow was admitted to the hospital July 7 and his condition has steadily grown worse.

Cousin Ed, as he is known to his close friends, retired as president of the Yankees in 1946, after a syndicate headed by Larry Macphail bought the American League club.

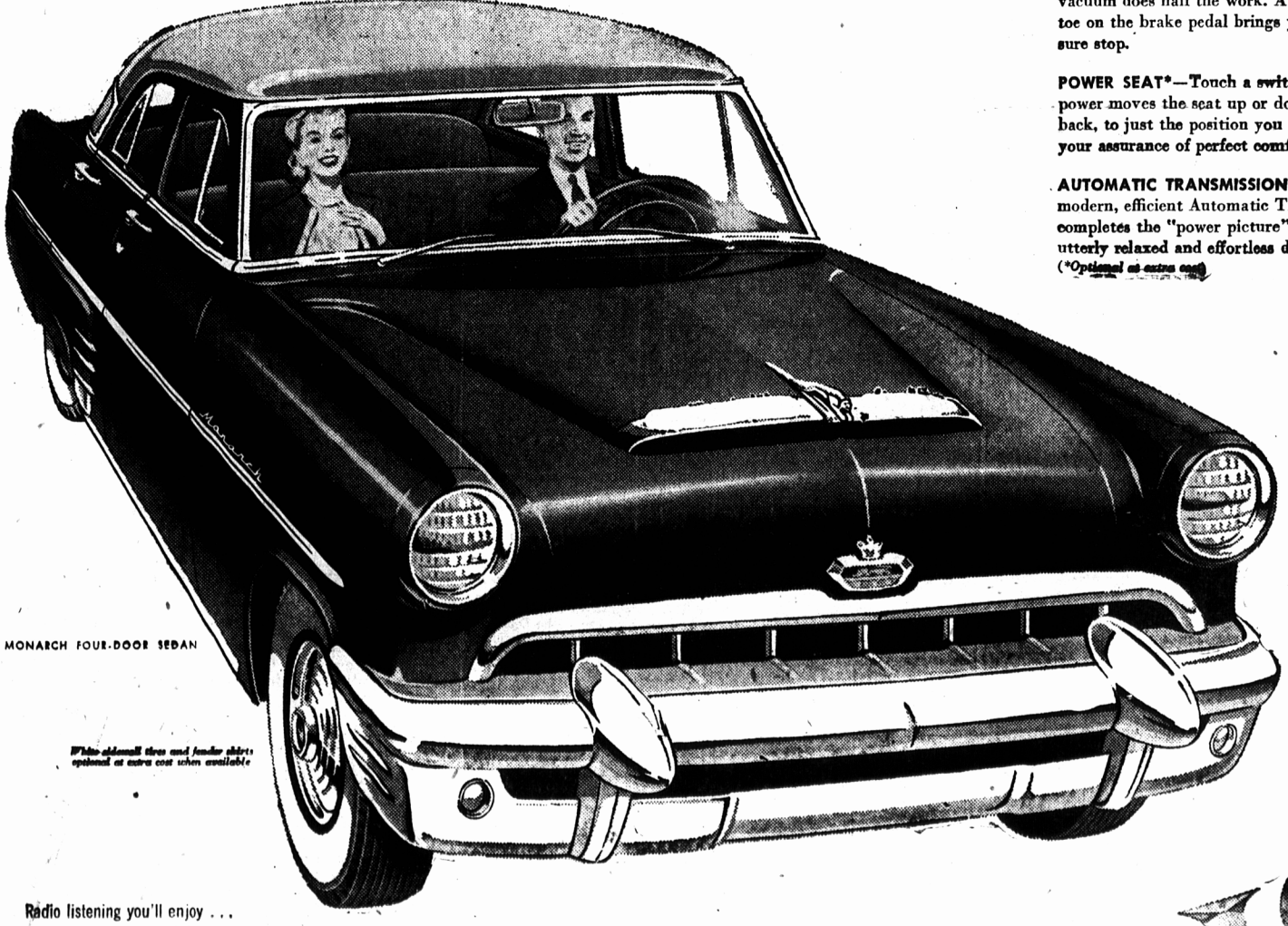
