It is said at Ottawa that Sir Richard Cartwright will be appointed high commissioner in London, and that William Gibson, ex-M. P. for Lincoln, will get Sir Richard's seat and portfolio.

Decision has been given in the matter of the stranding of the steamer Newfield. Captain Campbell's certificate is cancelled, Chief Officer Blakeny is suspended for three months and second Officer Callaghan is suspended one month.

It seems that some sort of an agreement was entered into to have him come to town yesterday and surrender to the authorities, but no arrest was made. Stewart has apparently taken advantage of this laxness and made good his escape.

Two charges of violating the Liquor Regulation Act, preferred against Andrew Doyle on complaint of J. N. Campbell, stand adjourned until Monday next. One charge is selling in a room not fitted according to law; the other is selling to a man after being notified not to do so by his wife. An assault case was disposed of for a nominal fine, the prosecutor declining to prosecute.
