CONTRACT BRIDGE

West dealer.
Both sides vulnerable.

NORTH
♠ Q854
♥ Q6
♦ A106
♣ 873

EAST
♠ 872

The bidding:
West North East South
1 ♠ Pass Pass Dble.
Pass 1NT Pass 2 ♠
Pass 2NT Pass 4 ♠

Opening lead—king of spades.

The goal to be sought by any declarer is to play each hand as though he sees the opponent's cards. A declarer would seldom make an error in the play if the position of all 52 cards were known to him.

For an example of fine reasoning along such lines, we cite this hand where declarer played his cards to a T and succeeded in making his contract.

West led a spade and then shifted to a trump. Declarer won in dummy and led a club to the jack, losing to the queen. West played the ace and another club which South ruffed.

Declarer drew two rounds of trumps and led a diamond to the ten, which held, pursuing his objective closely. South then ruffed dummy's last club.

By now the critical stage had been reached. Had declarer led the queen of diamonds to repeat the finesse, he would have been defeated. The ace would have captured West's king, but East would have acquired an unassailable diamond trick.

Instead, declarer selected the three diamonds to lead to the ace, caught the king, and made the contract.

It is interesting to note the reason for South's play of the three rather than the queen of jack. As can be seen, he gave up the opportunity to finesse against the king and played instead for the king to be alone. It turned out he was right, wonderfully enough, but the question before us is whether or not it was just a lucky shot that happened to hit the mark.

It wasn't. The clue to the actual situation could be found in the bidding. If West had held ♠ AKxx ♥ xx ♦ Kxx ♣ AQ 109, he would presumably have made the standard bid of one club.

But he had opened with one spade. Since West during the play had shown up with exactly two hearts and four clubs, his other cards could not include four spades and three diamonds—he would have bid a club if this were the case—but had to consist of five spades and two diamonds. Hence the diamond king was bound to fall when the three was led.

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Springhill Miner Is Coming Back
