Thursday's decline was general with the six indexes showing losses. Base metals had the biggest losses. Declines ranged to a point and a few new lows were reached.

The papers, banks, foods, constructions and western oils were lower in a fractional range. Refining 0-1 and pipelines were the only firm spots, while the papers and utilities were mixed to slightly lower.

The closing averages show the banks off .14 at 62.23, utilities off .2 at 155.2, industrials off .9 at 304.6, combined off .7 at 254.8, papers off 2.5 at 457.6 and golds off .7 at 82.07.

TORONTO

TORONTO (CP) — Industrials slipped back for the fifth straight session in light trading on the Toronto Stock Exchange Thursday. Industrials were the big losers as they dipped more than 1 1/4 points on index, their sharpest setback since March 16. Western oils were down almost one-half point as their index touched a new low for 1959. Golds and base metals were off a few decimal points.

NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP) — Airlines staged a late advance in a stock market which declined unevenly Thursday. Drugs and selected electronics also went ahead. Texas Instruments, up 1/4, and Litton Industries, up 3/4, were boosted by bullish rumors in a quiet electronics group. Rails and utilities declined. Steels, rubbers, oils and tobaccos were mixed.

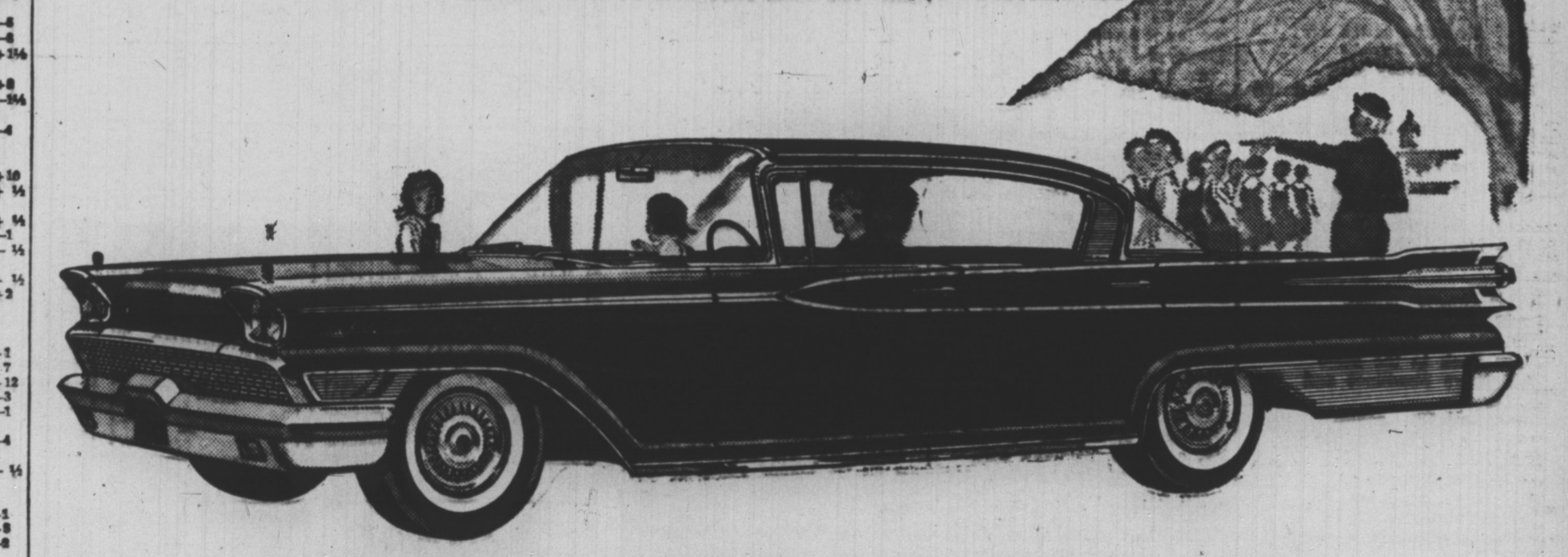
