**SENATOR FERGUSON'S SPEECH.**

had no effect then nor will they now. The Senate will now, as heretofore treat every measure as in their consciences they think it deserves.  
The object of returning to a cry against the Senate may be to divert attention from the many shortcomings of the administration. The people will do well to allow no herring to be drawn across their track.

**MANITOBA CONSPIRACY.**  
This Government obtained power through a conspiracy entered into between Sir Wilfrid Laurier and Messrs Greenway, Martin and Sifton in Manitoba. In the face of the most solemn assurances to the contrary, and the equally solemn provisions of the Manitoba Act, the Manitoba conspirators took away the privileges of the Roman Catholic minority of that province and forced a great religious contention on the people of Canada. While with one hand Sir Wilfrid Laurier patted Greenway on the back, the other was upheld to Heaven to emphasize his promise that if returned to power he would restore to the fullest extent the privileges that were taken away. As soon as the Grit party gained power by these Mephistophelian tactics the gang of conspirators came together to devise means of escape from the consequences of their doubled-faced conduct. We had what was called a final settlement submitted to the McCarthys at Brandon to secure the election of Clifford Sifton to the House of Commons, to be followed by concession after concession, as from time to time the minority declared its dissatisfaction with what was done.  
We have had delegation after delegation to Rome to invoke the interference of the Holy Father in the domestic affairs of Canada. The result of all this is that, today, separate schools are practically in operation in Manitoba without the sanction of law as they were by legislative authority before 1890. Laurier, Greenway and their accomplices are now laughing in their sleeves at the sincere, but foolish, Protestants who left this party in 1896 on account of the remedial bill. On the other hand the Roman Catholics are called upon to render thanks to the conspirators for restoring in dribbles and without the sanction law rights which ought never to have been interfered with. (Applause.)

The pages of history may be ransacked in vain for a parallel to all this. It is hard for honest men, Protestants or Catholics, to comprehend the refined wickedness which distracted Canada with this Manitoba School Question. The extravagance, incapacity, promise-breaking and corruption rampant in government affairs are fitting punishments for allowing ourselves to be drawn aside from the consideration of measures for the public good to an examination of this Pandora's Box thrown in our way by Laurier and Greenway.

**OTHER POINTS.**  
In going over the acts of the present Government it is almost a relief to find an instance of promise-keeping, and where there is a semblance of keeping faith with the people we gladly look into it. A plebiscite on prohibition was pronounced by Sir Wilfrid Laurier, and we have had it. A verdict in favor of prohibition has been rendered by the people, but a member of the administration has already declared that there will be no prohibition. This promise has cost the Treasury of Canada a quarter of a million dollars, and the people much trouble and expense. But nothing will come out of it. We also had a repeal of the Franchise Act and a return to the Provincial Franchises. In this connection the people of Prince Edward Island have to thank the Senate for righting the blunders of Sir Louis Davies and giving them a workable law.

Although Sir Louis Davies said, very insultingly, in 1896 that "all Prince Edward Island had turned grit" and that "a Conservative could not be found with a fine tooth comb," yet I am pleased to say that the Conservatives have not bowed the knee, and are, at least, as strong and as determined as ever. In the ridings of Prince our friends have not shrunk from contests with candidates of the ministry, and the results have been to convince everyone that nothing but Government patronage and human devices could save the Government from overwhelming defeat.

Let us today close up our ranks and prepare for the contest which may come sooner than the regular time. When Parliament is once dissolved the Government will be no longer able to terrorize the officials and the ability to win votes by promises of contracts and offices will pass from them.  
I now invite you to enter upon the earnest consideration of measures of organization. Let every polling district hold its meeting and have its work prepared, so that when the day of action comes the battle may be short, sharp and decisive. Prolonged applause.

**The Spanish Oath.**  
In Austria a Christian witness is sworn before a crucifix between two lighted candles, and, holding up his right hand, says, "I swear by God, the Almighty and All Wise, that I will speak the pure and full truth, and nothing but the truth, in answer to anything I may be asked by the court."  
Jewish witnesses, while using the same words, add to their solemnity by placing their hands on the page of a Bible on which is printed the third commandment.  
A Belgian witness swears to be veracious in these words, "I will speak the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth; so help me God and all the saints."  
The Spanish oath is more elaborate. The witness, kneeling on his right knee, places his hand on the sacred book, and, being asked by the judge, "Will you swear to God and by those holy gospels to speak the truth to all you may be asked?" answers, "Yes, I swear." Thereupon the judge says, "Then, if thus you do God will reward you, and if not will require of you." In some parts of the country the ceremony is different. The witness forms a cross by placing the middle of his thumb on the middle of his forefinger, and, kissing his thumb—a practice which would probably be very familiar to some English witnesses—exclaims, "By this cross I swear!"—Law Notes.

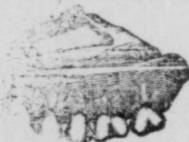
