153 Blood Donors Registered At O'Leary Clinic Yesterday

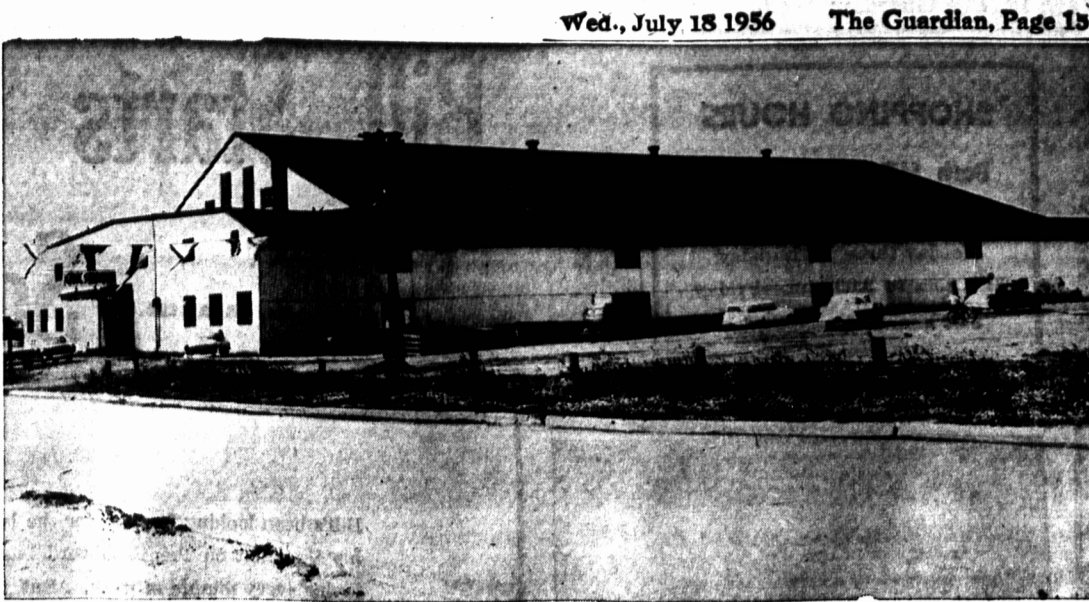
A new "high" in blood donors was established by O'Leary yesterday when 153 donors reported at the Red Cross Blood Donor Clinic held in the Canadian Legion Hall under the auspices of the O'Leary Women's Institute.

This was the first time an afternoon and evening clinic was held in O'Leary and while the number was somewhat below the objective set it was still a very creditable showing.

One young man, who received ten bottles of blood some two years ago when he had a bleeding ulcer, made a donation himself last night and brought along several other members of his family as donors.

The O'Leary Women's Institute, of which Mrs. H. J. MacWilliam is the President, looked after providing refreshments for the donors and workers to assist the Mobile Team. Members of the O'Leary High School Red Cross were also on hand and rendered valuable assistance.

Today's Clinics are to be held in the Canadian Legion Home at Kensington, under the auspices of the Legion, and must produce 250 donors — 100 this afternoon and 150 this evening. It is most important that this number be secured particularly since the objective set for the past two days has fallen considerably below the quota.
