Post War Brain Drain Is In Canada's Favor

OTTAWA (CP) — Canada has been on the receiving end of the post-war "brain drain," according to a research study prepared for the Economic Council of Canada.

The study made public here showed that in the years 1950 to 1963 Canada had an annual average inflow of professionally trained immigrants numbering 7,790, while there was an annual outflow of emigrants in the same categories numbering 5,476.

This left Canada with a net immigration of 2,314 professionals, trained people a year which the study found not only benefited the country but represented an investment asset of \$240,000,000 in education costs.

The study was prepared by Louis Parai of Drumheller, Alta, now a lecturer in the economics department at University of Western Ontario, who is working on a doctorate from Yale University. The economic council commissioned the work for its first annual review, published last December, and made the report public through the views expressed by Mr. Parai's STUDIED RECORDS.

Canada has a record of immigrants but keeps no record of emigrants. To study both the inflow and outflow, Mr. Parai had to consult immigration records of other countries.

He found that in addition to the movement of professionals, Canada had an average inflow of 18,284 skilled workers a year, against an outflow of 6,210, leaving the country with a net immigration of skilled workers numbering 12,074 a year between 1950 and 1963.

The report found that about 9,800 professional and skilled workers emigrated annually from Canada to the United States — giving rise to the much-discussed brain drain of skilled talent from Canada.

But the report also found the losses to the United States were more than offset by an average annual immigration of 26,300 professional and skilled workers from all countries.

Flood Picture Called Dismal In Areas Of Eastern Europe

KLAGENFURT, Austria (Reuters) — Impassable roads, blocked rail routes, wrecked bridges, stranded tourists and emergency airlifts presented a dismal picture Monday in many flood-hit areas of eastern Europe.

In the valleys of East Tyrol, Austrian air force helicopters began evacuating more than 1,000 tourists—mostly East Germans—stranded by the floods for the last five days. The evacuation was expected to take two days.

The Austrian helicopters also flew food, medical supplies and mail to inhabitants of 20 villages cut off for five days. Many roads in East Tyrol and Carinthia were still impassable Monday, but most of the rail traffic was resumed. More than 30 bridges were destroyed by the raging waters, and most direct routes between Austria and Italy and Yugoslavia were blocked.

In East Tyrol practically the entire road system, involving all the mountain valleys, was paralyzed. The Brenner Pass railway line was blocked on the Italian side.

RESTORE WATER SUPPLY — Rome's water supply was restored Monday—but the city's 2,500,000 inhabitants were warned not to drink it yet. A polluted aqueduct resulted in water being turned off for about half the city.

No official figures for casualties and damage caused by the floods in Italy have yet been published. But 30 persons were known to have died. Unofficial estimates said about 13,000 persons have had to leave their homes.

The main rail line between Florence and Rome was still blocked and trains were being diverted along the west coast route through Pisa.

In Moscow the Communist party newspaper Pravda reported that Soviet air force helicopters were flying in supplies to villages cut off by floods in the seaboard region north of Vladivostok.

The newspaper said troops and sailors were helping to build up defences against rivers which had burst their banks following heavy rains.

Hees Off To Europe To Seek Expansion

MONTREAL (CP) — George Hees, once a super-salesman in the federal cabinet and now president of the Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges, is going to Europe to try to convince businessmen to invest in Canada's expansion and to establish branch plants there.

"I am convinced that the only limitation on Canada's industrial expansion is the capital available to finance that expansion," Mr. Hees said in an interview. "We won't have enough capital of our own for sometime to finance that expansion."

"Therefore, I am going overseas to get it," he said.

He will leave Montreal Oct. 28, on a nine-city tour during which he hopes to meet top men in European business and finance.

His first stop will be Paris where he will remain until Nov. 5. His other stops will be Zurich, Geneva, Amsterdam, Brussels, Frankfurt, Basle, Milan, and London.

Preceding his departure he will preside at the official opening of a new quarters for stock exchanges in the new 47-story Place Victoria building in downtown Montreal Oct. 21.

AIDED BY GOVERNMENT

In planning his overseas trip, Mr. Hees has had the co-operation of the federal trade and commerce department, which he headed when he was a member of the former Progressive Conservative government. The department is supplying him with facts and figures on Canada's present economic situation and Canadian trade commissioners overseas are helping with arrangements for his meetings overseas.

At each of his stops, he will address luncheons to which the main business and financial leaders will be invited.

"I plan to outline to them Canada's present economic situation, the tremendous expansion which has occurred during the last four years and the expected expansion in the future," he said.

"The object will be to convince the financial and business leaders of Europe that they should greatly increase their investments in Canada and establish branch plants here to supply a growing market of 20,000,000 people."

Conference On Pollution Is Scheduled

MONTREAL (CP) — Representatives of government, industry and other bodies meet here Oct. 31-Nov. 3 to discuss pollution, described as "one of the country's most pressing problems," and what to do about it.

In the official terminology of the Canadian Council of Resource Ministers, the meeting's sponsor, "the conference is being convened to consider how the contamination of water, air and soil affects human and animal life and impedes the achievement of desirable social, economic and political goals in Canada."

In a statement released today, council president R. G. Williston, British Columbia's minister of lands, forests and water resources, gives the "pressing problem" description to pollution and adds:

"The continuing pollution of our water, of our air and of the soil rests upon our conscience. It is a problem to which every Canadian must turn his attention."

The statement says leading Canadian authorities have been invited to provide background papers which will review pollution's nature, extent and significance, the techniques for controlling it and the programs now operating to abate it.

MADE MOVE IN JUNE

The council decided to sponsor the pollution conference at its third plenary conference at Dalvay, P.E.I., June 22-23, when the problem was considered.

Mr. Williston said the conference represents the council's first major undertaking. The council was created by the federal and provincial governments in 1962 to establish a new approach in the orderly development of Canada's renewable natural resources. Each of the 10 provinces and the federal government is represented on the council by a cabinet minister.
