

# Hurrah Wins Free For All At Ch'town Driving Park

The bay gelding Hurrah won the featured free for all at the Charlottetown Driving Park Saturday evening on the basis of a better summary.

In the first dash of the two dash event, Spurge, starting on the rail weighed in the top followed by Hi Jay and Hurrah. As they field came around for the first half it was slipping out along the rail with Spurge in the lead followed by Hi Jay, Hurrah, Stalag Hanover and Peter on Top in that order. Peter on Top made his customary move on the paddock turn but was hung out and ran the rest of the race on the outside. Hurrah, in the three hole came on strong at the three quarter pole to outpace the rest of the field to the wire in a time of 2:07.4. Spurge hung on to his lead to place and Hi Jay took show money.

In the eighth dash Peter on Top, simply had too much steam for the rest of the field as he pranced home on top to give happy betters a \$16.40 return on a two dollar ticket. However Hurrah placed second in the dash and his 1:2 summary outdid Peter on Top's 5:1. The eighth dash was the second half of the second daily double and the combination of Jolly Abbe and Peter on Top paid \$170.40.

The evening's first double saw Amy Thorpe and Wayne's Pride combine to pay \$13.50. The Quinella feature on the third dash paid a handsome \$52.60 when the longshot Free Chance chased a favorite Mystery Judy to the wire. The best pay of the night was on the exact feature where Yankee Cadet and Chief Operator combined to pay a whopping \$351.20. Next action at the local park is slated for this evening.

# Orioles Whip Cleveland; Koufax Wins Fourteenth

 Curt Bleflary unloaded two home runs and two singles against Cleveland Saturday as Baltimore Orioles came from behind with a seven-run eighth-inning explosion for a 6-4 victory over the Indians.

The loss, coupled with Minnesota's 3-2, 11-inning victory over Kansas City, dropped the Indians into a tie with the Twins for the American League lead.

Don Mincher won it for the Twins with his second homer of the game, a leadoff shot off Jip Dickson in the 11th.

Bleflary, who earlier hit his 12th homer, sparked the uprising, slammng a three-run homer off reliever Jack Kralick that wiped out a 3-1 Cleveland lead. Jerry Adair closed out the rally with a three-run homer off Gary Bell.

**YANKS WIN AGAIN**  
 In other AL action, New York downed Boston 6-2, Detroit won over Washington 1-0 in a rain-shortened contest and Los Angeles Angels downed Chicago White Sox 5-1.

In the National League, the leading Los Angeles Dodgers won over Houston Astros 3-1 as Sandy Koufax pitched a five-hitter.

It was his eighth straight win and made him the first 14-game winner in the majors this season.

Lou Johnson's run-scoring single and sacrifice fly by Jim Lefebvre in the fourth proved decisive for the Dodgers.

Other NL games saw Chicago Cubs down San Francisco 4-1, St. Louis Cardinals blank New York Mets 2-0, Cincinnati outlast Philadelphia 10-3 and Pittsburgh defeated Milwaukee 9-5.

At Chicago, Marcelino Lopez and Bob Lee combined on a five-hitter as the Angels handed the White Sox their fifth loss in a row. The Angels put it away with a four-run fourth inning rally triggered by Willie Smith's homer.

The Yankees closed in within one game of the 500 level by trimming Boston behind the home runs of Bobby Richardson, Elston Howard and Clete Boyer. Richardson also had a triple and a double. The loss was the fifth straight for the Red Sox.

At Washington, Detroit's Denny McLain allowed the Senators only one hit Don Locke's single in the third—as he won his fifth straight game. George Thomas drove in the only run with a third-inning sacrifice fly.

Larry Jackson pitched a five-hitter in the Cubs' triumph over San Francisco. Billy Williams and Ed Bailey hit homers for the Cubs while Willie McCovey connected for the Giants. Ernie Banks drove in two Chicago runs with an eighth-inning single.

At Pittsburgh, Willie Stargell rapped three hits, including his 21st homer, and drove in three runs as the Pirates defeated Milwaukee. Roberto Clemente added three hits and drove in two runs while Gene Alley knocked in a pair with a single and a double. Mack Jones and Mike de la Hoz homered for the Braves.

St. Louis Cardinals winning streak reached four games after their win over the Mets. Phil Gagliano's homer provided the Cardinal runs while Tracy Stallard and Hal Woodeshick collaborated on a six-hit shut-out.

Cincinnati snapped a three-game losing streak and ended Philadelphia's six-game winning streak by outlasting the Phillies.


