- 1. Have your herd production tested
2. Choose the breeding program suitable to your herd
3. Allow all heifers unless abnormal to have one lactation
4. Cull cows 20% below herd average on 1st record
5. Cows from 20% below to herd average give a second record before culling

Dr. Kelly suggested that the provincial association should always endeavour to help the weaker clubs and reported some of the aid that had been given to two of the weaker clubs during the year under review.

ALL IN SAME POSITION Mr. Gordon said he considered everyone concerned—the special consultants as well as senior officials—the department became "confidential officials."

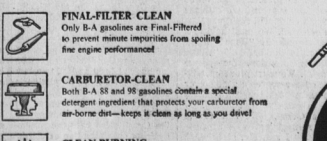
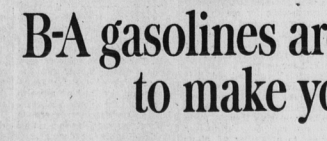
