J. E. Currie Inquest Is Adjourned

An inquest into the death of 53-year-old James Edward Currie of Rice Point has been adjourned to Tuesday, November 23th.

Coroner Dr. L.E. Prowse ordered the inquest on Thursday afternoon after seven members of the inquest jury viewed the body of the deceased and visited the accident scene.

Currie was killed Wednesday evening shortly before 5:30 when he was struck by a one-ton truck on the North River Road, about 40 yards from the Trans-Canada Highway.

The body was identified in the presence of the jury by Roy Wilson a cousin of the deceased who lives in the Rice Point area.

Members empaneled included Douglas Durber, foreman, Harold Larter, Sidney Stead, Eddie Bruce, Myron Bell, Arnold Bruce and Hugh Simpson.

The inquest will re-open again on November 25th at City Hall beginning at 7:30 p.m.

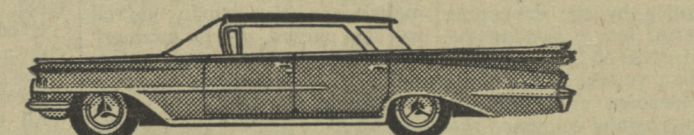

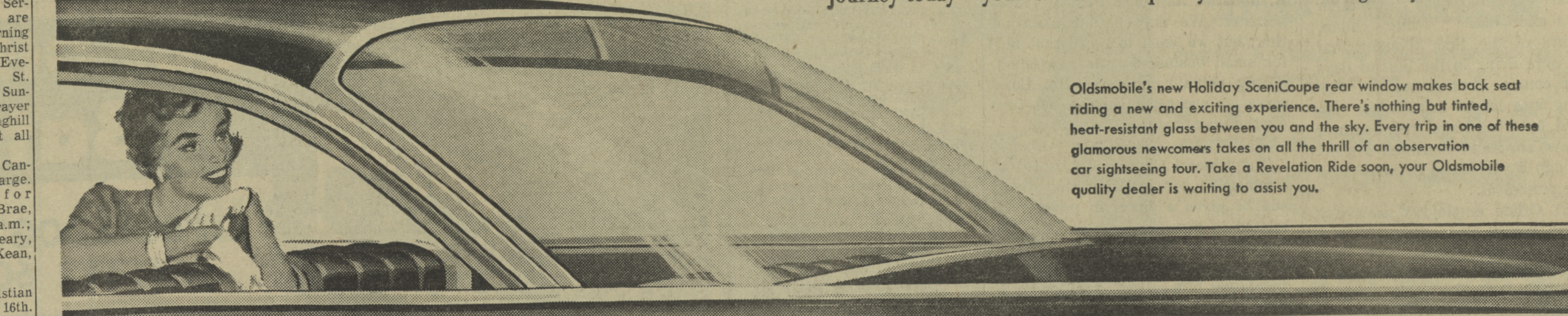
