WINNIPEG, July 9 - (CP) - Oats led the Winnipeg coarse grains market Saturday, chalking up gains of 5-8 to 1-1 1/2 cents. Trading was slow through most of the session, but livened up toward the close.

NOTICE TO BRITISH and ALLIED VETERANS who may be eligible under amendments to the WAR VETERANS ALLOWANCE ACT District offices of the Department of Veterans Affairs are now accepting applications from certain British and Allied veterans made eligible to apply for War Veterans' Allowance by amendments to the War Veterans' Allowance Act passed at the present session of Parliament. Complete details as to those eligible may be secured from the nearest district office of the Department of Veterans Affairs. In general, however, to be eligible a veteran who did not serve with the Canadian forces must have 20 years' residence in Canada, and meet the other qualifications of the Act as to service in the armed forces, income, assets and so forth. IMPORTANT - These amendments have been made effective April 1st, but retroactive payment can only be made if the veteran qualifies under the Act and makes his application to the nearest district office of the Department of Veterans Affairs by July 31st.
