No Formality Planned For Queen At Gander

GANDER, Nfld. (CP) - No guard of honor, no formality and no hunting will greet Queen Elizabeth and Prince Philip when they land here for a 45-minute transit stop on their way to the Caribbean today.

J. D. James, manager of the international air terminal, said the Queen requested that receptions be kept at a minimum and that no special decorations be placed at the terminal. He said the Queen's visit will be "treated as simply and informally as possible."

Mr. James said the Queen would be greeted by Lt. Gov. Fabian O'Dea and Mrs. O'Dea, Premier J. R. Smallwood and Gander Mayor Jack Robertson and Mrs. Robertson. There is a possibility several other Newfoundland dignitaries may be presented to the Queen.

The terminal will be open to the public during the Queen's stop with only certain parts of the building restricted. Some school children will be given designated areas near where the Queen will be but high school students are to be treated as the general public.
