Return Of Rebel Tories In U.K. Is Met Politely

December when he disagreed with his independent colleagues in their criticism of British policy in Cyprus. Two others, Sir Victor Raikes and Angus Maude, have resigned their seats. The remaining five, Lord Hinchinbrooke, Paul Williams, John Biggs, Davidson, Lawrence Turner and Anthony Fell, have continued sporadic attacks on what they regard as the government's failure to show sufficient vigor in asserting its influence abroad. They bitterly opposed any indication that Britain's policies were subject to American influence and remained hostile to the United Nations because of its intervention in the Suez dispute. But they approved British military aid to the Sultan of Muscat and Oman in quelling a rebellion and particularly welcomed recent indications that Prime Minister Macmillan is prepared to send troops to assist President Camille Chamoun of Lebanon if he calls for assistance against his Arab nationalist opponents.

Reports Nurses Resist Changes

OTTAWA (CP)—A hospital administrator said Friday he finds a lot of resistance to change from nurses, and not from doctors. Dr. L. O. Bradley, Winnipeg General Hospital administrator, told the Canadian Nurses Association's convention he spends a good deal of his time acting as "an arbitrator between the MD and the RN."
