introducing the stars, constellations, meteors, moon and planets in an entertaining manner. This show which lasts about a half hour, is popular with young preschoolers, to Grade three.

"Footsteps" deals with man's dream to go to the moon and also explains how the earth and moon formed and why they become quite different worlds.

"The World's Unknown" sends the audience on a simulated journey through the solar system to see the planets and moons.

"The Universe of Dr.

Einstein" outlines the highlights of the life and work of scientist Dr. Albert Einstein.

"They Walked by Starlight" describes the major steps in the development of astronomy from the dawn of civilization. The show also confronts the audience with the larger issues in astronomy,

such as the expansion of the universe and the eternal question of how it all began.

"Star of Bethlehem" tells the traditional Christmas story and discusses various theories on what the star may have been.
