**Strike Involves Only Hundred Is Biggest Crisis in 25 years**

VANCOUVER (CP) — A bitter waterfront dispute that involves four unions but only about 100 strikers is developing into what is believed to be the biggest British Columbia labor crisis in 25 years.

Back of the dispute are sections of British Columbia's Trades Union Act which forbid sympathy picketing and secondary boycotts and a jurisdictional dispute between the Seafarers' International Union, recently expelled from the Canadian Labor Congress, and the National Association of Marine Engineers (N.A.M.E.).

The company involved, Northland Navigation Company, which has the only scheduled freight service to northern B.B. points, is operating its ships with SIU engineers replacing striking members of N.A.M.E.

SIU members are also handling cargoes because longshoremen refused to work struck ships.

**AGRICULTURAL NEWS**

P.E.I. Department of Agriculture

**MANNER EFFECTS TEST**  
The manner of milking cows is most important in relation to butter fat production, even when it is done regularly and gently by the same milker.

Milk completely dry: In the first place, the percentage of fat is much higher in the last portion of milk taken from the cow at each milking. It is therefore very important that each cow be milked completely dry. This warning goes doubly where a milking machine is used as hand serving must be practiced with a machine to be sure the job is complete. It is interesting in this connection to note that evening milking is richer than morning milking and the shorter the interval between milking the higher the butter fat content of the milk.

Various other causes: Failure to feed the herd some evening would probably result in a higher test, but considerably lower the milk out put.

Milk from cows in heat usually test higher than otherwise. Cows tend to give richer milk when in good flesh. Failure to cool milk properly in hot weather may reduce the test.

Moderate exercise tends to enrich the milk of most cows.

Don't blame the tester: Your cow is a prima donna, she is a sensitive temperamental female with a tendency to become upset and unpredictable unless treated with the utmost care and consideration. Here is another case where your best efforts pay off richly.

So don't worry about the tester if your product doesn't test consistently.

Check up on her highness, the cow. See if she is pleased, if she has a sense of security, of being appreciated, of being well cared for. Ninety-nine times out of a hundred that's where the trouble lies.

**ROTATIONAL GRAZING**  
Try daily rotational grazing this summer if you want to graze more cows on each acre of pasture.

All you need is an electric fence charger, barbed wire, insulators and posts.

Here is how it works: Divide your pasture field into long, narrow strips about the size your herd will graze off in four or five days. Then, by using cross wires, allow the herd to have new forage each day. A stocking rate of about 50 cows to each acre of fresh area daily is about right. Let the cows back-track for not more than four or five days before moving them to a new strip.

**SPREAD DROPPINGS**  
Under such an intensive grazing

program, the droppings must be spread. An ordinary harrow can be used for this purpose. Some dairymen report excellent results from using a piece of woven wire under a harrow with the teeth set in vertical position.  
When this method of grazing is used, it is not uncommon to produce enough forage to carry two or even more dairy cows on each acre of pasture. To the herd owner, this means more milk produced on each acre used to grow pasture. The result is a higher net income for each acre in the farm.
