Hollinger Mines Report Profits

MONTREAL (CP) — Hollinger Consolidated Gold Mines, Ltd. announced Wednesday net profit of \$9,522,990 in 1965 against \$8,862,933 in 1964.

The company's annual report disclosed current assets at \$20,935,040 in 1965 against current liabilities of \$5,017,165, with the bank loan reduced from \$3,000,000 in 1964 to \$1,000,000 in 1965.

Labrador Mining and Exploration Co. Ltd. one of the chief Hollinger subsidiaries, had net profits of \$7,656,400 in 1965, compared with \$7,812,636 in 1964. The report said the decrease was a result of the downward adjustment to formula governing sales.

Hollinger North Shore Exploration Co., Ltd., another company subsidiary had net profits of \$1,638,000 in 1965 compared with \$1,618,000 in 1964.

The report said that the end of the tax-free period on Iron Ore Company of Canada Operations in the Carol Lake area will exercise an adverse effect in 1966 on the net earnings of the Hollinger subsidiary, Labrador Mining.

External Affairs Minister Martin said last week in the Commons that there are no direct shipments of Canadian arms to Viet Nam.

Biggest producer of explosives in Canada is Canadian Industries Ltd. of Montreal.

Canadian Explosives Sale Being Stepped Up To U.S.

OTTAWA (CP) — Exports of Canadian military explosives to the United States are growing rapidly to help meet American needs in the Viet Nam war, authorities said here.

Exports this year are expected to exceed amounts produced for Canadian commercial use in 1965. Domestic commercial production last year was 292,000,000 pounds, double the amount of four years previously.

Officials said export licences are not required for sales of Canadian military explosives to the U.S.

"We sell to the U.S. and what they do with them is their business," one official said.

Amounts of military explosives exported by Canada are not listed separately by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. They are lumped in either with industrial chemical specialties or with various military ordnance.

Statistics do show that the value of industrial chemical specialties and explosives shipped to the U.S. last year was \$4,322,789 with nearly \$1,000,000 of this accounted for in December.

Chrysler Plans Modification On Throttle Linkage On Cars

WASHINGTON (AP) — Senator Waller F. Mondale (Dem., Minn.) said here the Chrysler Corp. is calling in some 17,500 of its 1966 Dodge Monacos and Polaras for modification of the throttle linkage but its letter to owners says nothing about a safety factor.

Mondale contended in a statement that safety is involved but he said a survey by his staff authorized Dodge dealers here and in Minneapolis and St. Paul, Minn., indicated, with one exception, that they are assuring Dodge owners the modification has nothing to do with safety.

Last week Mondale introduced a "fair warning act" which would require car manufacturers to give owners and dealers immediate warning of all defects that could involve safety and to spell out the nature of the defect.

In a Senate speech then, he cited a number of instances in which he said manufacturers had failed to give car owners notice of defects involving a safety hazard.

VERIFY CALLBACK Mondale said the call-back of the Dodge Monacos and Polaras was verified by Robert H. Kline of Detroit, manager of service for Chrysler's Dodge division, in a telephone conversation with members of the staff.

Kline was quoted as saying that a modification is being made in the throttle linkage of Dodge Polaras and Monacos equipped with a 383 cubic inches displacement engine and two-barrel carburetor.

"Kline said the modification involved lengthening the throttle linkage to prevent the engine from running too fast while slowing down and stopping," Mondale's statement said. "He said the defect caused the engine to idle too fast and had a tendency to require heavier braking pressure and to increase stopping distance."

Mondale said Kline advised that he knew of no accidents as a result of the defect but told the senator's aides it did involve a safety factor. "We were concerned enough to make the change," Kline was quoted as saying.

Mondale said that on the basis of Kline's description, the safety factor involved in the Dodge modification did not appear so serious as other situations that have come to his attention. But he criticized what he called Chrysler's failure to tell owners and dealers about it.
