## Charge By Call-Girl Madam Investigated At Vancouver

VANCOUVER (CP) — Mayor Bill Rathie said a state-  
ment by a former call-girl  
madam last year she paid po-  
lice and civil officials for pro-  
tection is still being investi-  
gated.

The mayor made the state-  
ment in city council after Ald.  
Tom Campbell said he had in-  
formation concerning state-  
ments made by Olva Diana Eld-  
ridge last December in Exche-  
quer Court.

In making a demand for an  
independent inquiry into the po-  
lice department—perhaps by At-  
torney-General Robert Bonner—  
Mr. Campbell demanded to know  
what had happened to the in-  
vestigation into the charges.

He also wanted to know what  
happened to a 1962 investigation  
started when seven members of  
the force were alleged to have  
been involved in break-ins and  
enterings in the city and with  
the thefts of television sets.

Lewis E. Phenser, senior  
vice-president of Kimberly-  
Clark Corp. and a former presi-  
dent of the Association of Cana-  
dian Advertisers, told the as-  
sociation's 50th annual meeting

"Day and night, from coast  
to coast, our country is filled  
with the reverberating sounds  
of the same words—such new  
ones—as are introduced are  
seized upon quickly by the  
others, like so many parasites  
after a tidbit, and the cycle  
continues."  
Mr. Phenser, a native of Hal-  
ifax, said that unless advertis-  
ing starts using words properly  
"we will indeed run out of lan-  
guage to communicate the at-  
tributes and merits of our pro-  
ducts to the public."
